### WHAT WE ARE ASKING FOR.

What we are asking for is only that our union with Canada shall be completed. It is not that we shall have a bond of union written upon parchment. It is not that customs and excise barriers shall be abolished. It is not that for administration we shall have one central Government controlling our postal system, our customs, our militia and all our greater affairs of state. These we have. But union in the full sense of the word means much more than this. As in the healthy human body the arteries carry the life blood to the extremities and the veins bring it back to the heart, while nerves, ligaments and muscles supply the power of communication and of motion, so in the national life railways become the great arteries and veins of commerce while along these lines run also the electric wires and mail communication which are the nerves of the state. Without these organs and faculties in perfect working there can be no enjoyable and progressive life in the nation. We all realise the paralysis and pain which come from a severed or a diseased nerve. We all know what happens when an artery is clogged, or severed. In the one case the embolus must be removed or absorbed, or death results. In

the other the opened artery must be repaired or the patient will bleed to death. For thirty-two years the electric nerve which connects Prince Edward Island with the rest of Canada was periodically put out of action during twelve hours out of each twenty-four. During the remaining twelve hours it was half-paralysed by pressure of double rates. Under these conditions there could be no proper and effective union. Fortunately for us after long continued complaint, the pressure and the periodical closure are now things of the past. When a united people made their case clear the Government heard them and applied the remedy. But the great artery of commerce between the Island and the Mainland of Canada is yet periodically closed by an embolism which stops all circulation. Sometimes it is for a week, sometimes for two or three weeks, sometimes, as during the past three years, for two months at a time. During that period while ocean steamers crossed the Atlantic from port to port eight times this Island was wholly cut off from trade with the rest of Canada. This Province was not nourished, its trade and industry were paralysed, and the hard toll of years cannot make good the loss. The annual recurrence of this appalling malady of the body politic must be prevented if we are to have a real union with Canada. And there is no other complete or effectual remedy in sight but the Tunnel. Without complete physical union, based on a principle of justice and equity union that will place this Province on terms of equality with the other Provinces as to the daily interchange of commerce, with equal facilities and equal rewards for industry, the union compact is a bond of injustice, a badge of slavery to us. Without such perfected union on a just basis this Island Province becomes a source of weakness rather than of strength to the Dominion. Under our present conditions Prince Edward Island is fast becoming a decayed limb, a paralysed member of the body of the Dominion. The cause of this is patent to all. The severed artery of commerce bleeds both the trunk and the limb. The channel of communication must be restored and established in healthful condition. This is the business of sound statesmanship, of equity, of justice. A clear, efficient and certain remedy is known. It is within easy reach. It will fulfil the bond. It will complete the severed chain of inter-provincial communication from the Atlantic to the Pacific. It will remove a great injustice and place all the Provinces on an equal footing. That remedy, it is needless to say is the construction of a railway Tunnel at the Capes.

Mr. Tarte seems to be in pretty cordial sympathy with Sir Wilfrid Laurier these days, and in his newspaper, La Patrie, deplors the fact that the federal Premier has no newspaper or prominent public man in Ottawa to defend him at the present time.

Since the popular vote in Chicago in favor of the city owning and operating its street railways it is found that the street railway companies of other American cities are taking more pains to please their public patrons. These autocratic corporations, whether operating street railways or city lighting have been awakened to the fact that the people may assert their rights, and that it is wiser to give good service at reasonable rates than to run the risk of having their franchises curtailed or abolished.
