VENGEANCE AT LAST.

NEW YORK, May 20—After a pursuit of ten years around the world, agents of the Camorra of Italy, last night found Angelo Delino, said to have turned traitor to the organization in Palermo a decade ago. Five previous attempts had been made to kill him. The one last night succeeded. Bullets fired by three strangers who entered a Brooklyn dance hall where Delino was sitting at a table chatting with friends killed him instantly.

In the turmoil following the shooting the murderers escaped. Delino, who came to Brooklyn in 1911, was employed by a contracting firm. He was telling his friends the story of the world-wide chase after him and declared that at last he felt safe when he met his fate.

VANCOUVER ISLAND HEN IS CHAMPION EGG-LAYER.

VICTORIA, B. C., May 20—All honor to the Vancouver Island hen; complete returns from the international egg-laying contest for April show a total in favor of the Island birds nearly double those of the United States and England per hen. The proportion is best illustrated by a comparison of figures: North American contest, average yield per hen, 47.5; English contest, average yield per hen, 43.8; International (Vancouver Island), average yield per hen, 71.7. This illustrates what a wonderful climate the Island possesses for stimulating egg production.

LONDON, May 20—Caruso has been gravely insulted. The great tenor has been told his "divine notes" were "pigs."
