

AMONG THE HORSES

When Frank Fox sent Andy Ashland a mile in 2:14 1/4 in the third heat of the free-for-all at the Waterville meeting, he not only clinched the race but went the fastest mile on any track in Maine for many years.

Andy Ashland had rather soft picking in the race for 2:16 pacers at Waterville last week, capturing the event in 2:14 1/4. Harlem Express won the 2:30 trot stakes in 2:21 1/4 and Baby Doll the 2:27 mixed in 2:22 1/4.

Two Fredericton horses, James W. McKinnon and Roy Vole, won out at Houlton last Friday, the former getting away with the 2:23 trot in 2:13 1/4 and the latter taking the 2:20 mixed in 2:19 1/4. Bangor, a Maine entry, won the 2:19 mixed in 2:15 1/4.

Peter Worthy, 2:09 1/4, is a versatile performer. He took his record in the 2:13 pace at Munroe, and the following week was given a mark trotting of 2:23 1/4. He is a four-year-old by Guy Axworthy, 2:08 1/4, out of a Peter the Great mare.

Earl Jr. won the free-for-all on the closing day of the meeting at Woonsocket. He was closely pressed by Baron Hall, which took the third heat. The best time was 2:11, made in the second heat. Birdie Alezo won the 2:15 pace in 2:14 1/4, and Sox Deforest the 2:21 trot in 2:13 1/4.

The performance of Napoleon Direct was not the only feature of the Columbus race. Reliable reports indicate that still another two-minute pacer was foreshadowed in that event; indeed, it is reported with reliability that Peter Stevens was separately timed in just two minutes in the heat that Geers stallion won in 1:59 1/4. In that case it may be regarded as practically certain that this son of Peter the Great may be expected to beat two minutes in the near future.

Murtagh Hughes, of Bangor, Me., has purchased the winner of the free-for-all at the Eastern Maine State Fair, Wendwood, driven by Pottle. This horse was purchased a few years ago for \$2,000, and has a record of stepping the last half in a race at 1:02. Mr. Hughes will race him during the season, having bought his entries with the horses. Wendwood was purchased with his complete outfit, including boots, harness and sulky, and with his entries, is considered a mighty good buy at the price paid.

It certainly was a great race that Napoleon Direct paced for Geers at Columbus when he gave the veteran driver his first ride below two minutes, but if the timers who caught the chestnut stallion the last half of the second mile—the one paced in 2:01—56 1/2 seconds, right, there are still greater things in store for this son of Walter Direct. His race at Columbus averages less than one second lower than the average of Directum I's two heats by which he holds the world's record for a two-heat race. Only one other pacer besides Directum I has paced two faster heats in a race than Napoleon Direct did, that is William, which paced two of his three heats in his world's record three-heat race in 2:00 1/4 and 2:00 which took one-quarter of a second faster than the two heats in the Columbus race. If Napoleon Direct remains sound there seems to be the best of reasons for believing that he will cut his present record appreciably before the season ends.

Grand Opera took the free-for-all at Three Rivers, Que., in straight heats, stepping the second mile in 2:12 1/4.

The 2:15 trot and pace, the feature event of the Princeton, Me., fair, was taken by Lady Fondley in 2:17 1/4.

Not in a long time has the Grand Circuit had such interesting contests in the feature stake events as Mabel Trask and St. Frisco are furnishing.

Slippery Bill, 2:19 1/4, the Fredericton pacer, has been sold to Ira Carpenter, of Patten, Me. The price paid was about \$300. Mr. Carpenter, it is reported, has also bought Shrub, Pat. Doherty's game trotter, for a sum in the vicinity of what he paid for Slippery Bill.

The Boston Globe points out that while Emma Magowan's 2:13 1/4 at Goshen is the race record for a two-year-old trotter over a half-mile track the mark for that age and gait for a twice-round stands to the credit of Will Bing, 2:12 1/4, a son of Binjolla, 2:17 1/4.

Acker's Little Smoke beat the speedy Quebec mare Frankie Bogash in the 2:18 pace at Three Rivers, winning the money. Little Smoke was second in the first heat to the Newport, Vermont, horse, Boden, who won in straight heats in 2:17 1/4, 2:17 1/4, 2:18, Gordon Rex, Ottawa, winning second money.

On Getaway Day of the Poughkeepsie meeting Napoleon Direct, driven by Geers, broke the track pacing record, his time in the second heat of "The Directum I" 2:00 pace, being 2:00 1/4. The former track record was 2:02 1/4, held by The Eel. Allie Watts on the 2:13 trot in 2:07 1/4, Sirs Bingen the 2:18 race in 2:08 1/4, Mirful the 2:07 trot in 2:10, and Brescia the 2:16 trot in 2:09 1/4.

Horse races for \$250 were the features of the Gouverneur, New York fair, the other day. A report says:—W. F. Lehipp, of Leominster, Mass., was the starter of the races. He is a most versatile performer in that between heats he sang sentimental songs through a megaphone accompanied by the Edwards band. He possesses an excellent voice and won much applause.

For the information of a correspondent it may be pointed out that the two-minute horses are Uhan, 1:58; Lou Dillon, 1:58 1/4; Major Delmar, 1:59 1/4; troopers, Dan Patch, 1:55 1/4; Directum I, 1:56 1/4; William, 1:58 1/4; Minor Heir, 1:58 1/4; Audubon Boy, 1:59 1/4; Frank Bogash, Jr., 1:59 1/4; Star Pointer, 1:59 1/4; Prince Alert, 1:59 1/4; Napoleon Direct, 1:59 1/4; Single G., 2:00; pacers, Star pointer was the first horse to beat 2:00 1/2.

Mabel Trask landed another win at Poughkeepsie the second day of the Grand Circuit meeting when she romped away with the 2:12 \$2,000 trot in three straight heats, negotiating the second mile in 2:07 1/4. Azora Axworthy was the contender. The same day Expressive Lou won the Guy Axworthy \$2,000 purse for three-year-old trotters in 2:10 1/4 and 2:12, and General Todd took the 2:05 \$1,200 pace from Russell Boy and White Sox in 2:05 1/4.

The trotting horse world may well feel proud of Peter the Great (2:07 1/4). As a sire he has forty 2:10 performers to his credit, of which thirty-five are trotters. In 1915 60 new standard performers, sired by Peter the Great, entered the list. The fastest of his offspring is Peter Volo, 4 (2:02), the world's three- and four-year champion. Among the greatest futr-old trotters, among the credit of Peter the Great are Peter Volo, 4 (2:02), Grace (2:04 1/4), Sadie Mac (2:06 1/4), Czareva (2:07 1/4), Peter Thompson, 3 (2:07 1/4), Volga, 2 (2:07 1/4), and Miss Harris M., 3 (2:07 1/4).

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

A PRISONER IN THE CASTLE.

(Acts, 22.)

Golden Text.—"He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in Him will I trust."—Psalm 91:2.

Most men in Paul's position when he was rescued from certain death by the commander of the Roman garrison, would have been satisfied to disappear from the sight of the mob into obscurity of the castle. But Paul was eager to turn to the occasion in giving his testimony to the power of Christ. How often the followers of Jesus on much slighter provocation than Paul seek their own safety instead of judiciously using the critical situation as a means of pressing Christ's claims upon men.

Verses 1, 2. Paul addressed the crowd in Hebrew. It was their own sacred and beloved language. Its use instead of the international Greek which they probably all would have understood just as well was an indication of his patriotism and loyalty to the national tradition. It was a successful stroke. The multitude quieted down. The preacher of the gospel acts wisely who avails himself of the attachment of his audience to places, times and customs and secures their attention thereby.

Verses 3-16. The speech of Paul to the multitude contains the second of the three accounts we have of his conversion. In all essentials it is identical with the other two (Acts 9 and 26). It is given here as a possible means of overcoming the prejudices of his opponents. It aims to explain how he who had at one time been just as bitterly opposed to Christ came to recognize him as his Lord and Master. The appeal is precisely the same as that made by the converted gambler or thief or drunkard to those who still remain in their sinful condition. It is a defensive argument; but it is also a plea to follow in the path trodden by the speaker.

As a means of defence Paul's narrative of his conversion was intended to justify his change from fanatical Judaism to enthusiastic Christianity. In making the change he was following the guidance of a power from above. They must admit that a supernatural mandate should be obeyed. When a person lays claim to having done what he had done under divine guidance or command others must either cease to hold him responsible or declare him insane, provided, of course, that they believe he is sincere in his declaration.

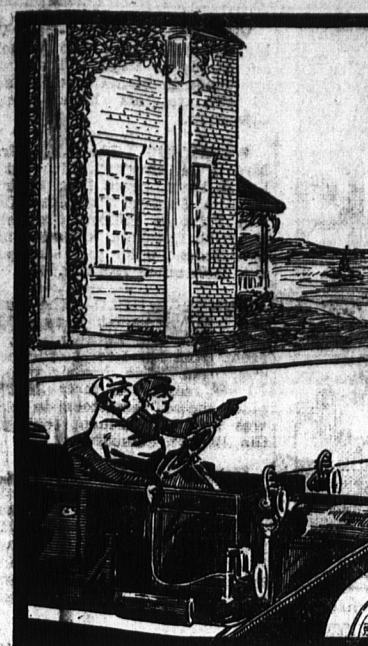
But if Paul's claim was conceded, if he had been guided by a voice from heaven, then his story acquired all the force of an argument for the change of every hearer of his from his Judaism to Christianity. If Christ was the Lord and Master of one faithful Jew, he was by the same right the master of all. An experience of supreme reality cannot remain valid for the individual only. Hence the impulse to communicate by experience. This is the basis of the convictions which men arrive at of the missionary motive everywhere.

Verses 17-21. The Jews listened to Paul quietly throughout the whole of his account of his personal conversion. But he had something more to say. His defence was not complete with the explanation of his acceptance of Christ as Messiah. He had not only done that, but he had also given this Messiah to the Gentiles. In so doing he had broken down the middle wall of partition between Jews and Gentiles. He had denied the exclusive claims of the Jew to divine favor. He had obliterated the line of distinction between the clean Israelite and unclean heathen. This appeared to be the height of impiety. Yet it was involved in the acceptance of Christ; and if the acceptance of Christ was the will of God, the natural consequences of it must be also viewed as such. Paul was thoroughly consistent.

Verses 22-23. Paul's allusion to his mission to the Gentiles swept away the barriers which were keeping in check the pent up wrath of the multitude. His own private change of views they could tolerate; even his preaching of Jesus as the Messiah might pass, though not without a vigorous protest; but the unrestrained intercourse with the Gentiles which Judaism lost its distinctiveness was like casting hot things to the swine to be trampled underfoot. The man guilty of this supreme offence was judged unworthy to live. The fury of the mob broke in new and more violent expressions. The blindness of the mob is quite apparent to-day. What they regarded as sacrilege on Paul's part was the sincerest and most enthusiastic service of God. It was honoring Judaism and not stripping it of its divinity to purge it of its temporary and accidental features and invite the whole world to accept it as God given religion of mankind. What the Jews of that day thought a disgrace the world of today considers a source of glory. Paul's enemies, however, were not the only men who made the mistake of confusing the husk with the kernel.

PREMIER ZAIMIS OF GREECE HELD CONFERENCE WITH KING CONSTANTINE

(Canadian Press Despatch.) LONDON, Sept. 11.—An Athens despatch says that Premier Zaimis had another lengthy conference with King Constantine on Sunday afternoon after which the cabinet met in regard to the shots fired in the neighborhood of the French legation the despatch says that the allies demand have apparently been fully accepted, although nothing has been officially announced. The closing of the clubs of the reservists league, a step demanded by the Entente, was begun on Sunday.

BANGOR WATER FRONT HAS \$150,000 FIRE

BANGOR, Me., Sept. 11.—Fire, which originated from spontaneous combustion in soft coal in the yards of the Hincks Coal Company, on the Bangor water front, at 3 o'clock Sunday morning, caused a loss estimated at nearly \$150,000. Coal sheds, a machine shop, offices, a modern coal digging plant and wharf property was destroyed, along with hundreds of tons of coal. The buildings of the Eastern Steam Corporation caught fire at times, but were extinguished by work on the part of the firemen. Dan Goodwin, a fireman, knocked overboard by a stream of water from a fire hose, and could not swim, was in danger of drowning. John Wilshire, a fireman, dived for him, and was nearly helpless when Guy Peavy, a third fire-fighter, rescued them. Peavy is a man of physique, and pulled the men hauling a wire rope which grasped. His companions, in gratulating him, called him a derrick.
