## SHAMROCK II BEING RUSHED.

Glasgow, Scot., Feb. 29.—The protest of Mr. George L. Watson against the slow progress of the work on the Shamrock II, has had good effects and during the past week the yacht has grown at a remarkable rate. Quite two thirds of her outer plating is now in place, riveted up and smoothed off. The plates are of manganese bronze three eighths of an inch in thickness and varying from two feet to three and a half in width. In the top sides and overhangs the plates are overlapped and riveted by a double row of rivets to give extra strength to the seams. Below the water-line, however the butts of the plates are brought edge to edge and are fitted with great accuracy, a burnishing machine being used to make the joints dead smooth and giving the burnished sides of the yacht a striking appearance.

## THE ICY ARENA

Mr. John F. Davidson Defies His Audience  
MANY DIFFICULT FEATS  
The Races Elicit Much Enthusiasm—Colored Race Won by Geo Mills.

Upwards of 600 people assembled yesterday evening in Hillsboro Rink to witness the exhibition of stilt, acrobatic and trick skating given by Mr. John F. Davidson, the world's greatest fancy skater. It was Mr. Davidson's second appearance in Charlottetown and possibly that fact added largely to the interest and the attendance.

At 8.15 Mr Davidson appeared on the ice on stilts which were strapped to his legs and gave the skater an elevation of about two feet above the ice. He first went through the different edges, followed by the cutting of the figure three, the Dutch roll, one foot serpentine, figure eight, Bishop eight, spread eagle and after a number of other original movements he finished with the flat foot whirl, one of the most difficult tricks to perform on stilts. Those with the faintest idea of skating must know that skating on stilts is not an easy matter as it requires the greatest power in the legs and in order to do a figure the skater cannot be under the body but must be on either side.

The performer then retired for a moment or two and changed his skates, re-appeared and performed a series of the most difficult feat work which included the serpentine, one foot H, forward and backward, cutting of the pivot loop, double three, forward and backward with a cut off, outside edge with toe catch in back, changing to outside edge in opposite direction, Philadelphia twist, crape vines, introducing special features, Bishop eight with cut off, Barney jump, cork screw whirl, one foot whirl, flat foot whirl, the spread eagle with turn in the air. He also introduced many other difficult tricks and movements which are peculiar to himself.

Mr. Davidson also gave an exhibition of high jumping, clearing 3 feet 9 inches, world's record, and jumping over four barrels placed length-wise on the ice. He attempted to jump 9 ft 10 inches but failed.

The half mile race between George Mills and Bert Mills for the colored championship, was won by the former by half a lap, Bert falling and losing considerable ground. Time 1.35.

The one mile contest between John F. Davidson and Mal Stewart was won by Stewart amid the cheers of the spectators. Time 4:00-25.

Davidson was labouring under a great disadvantage owing to the small rink.

At the conclusion of the Davidson-Stewart race the former congratulated his opponent upon his splendid race.

In Westville, N. S. on the 13th inst., Davidson did a mile in 2:55, beating the world's record in an eleven lap rink.

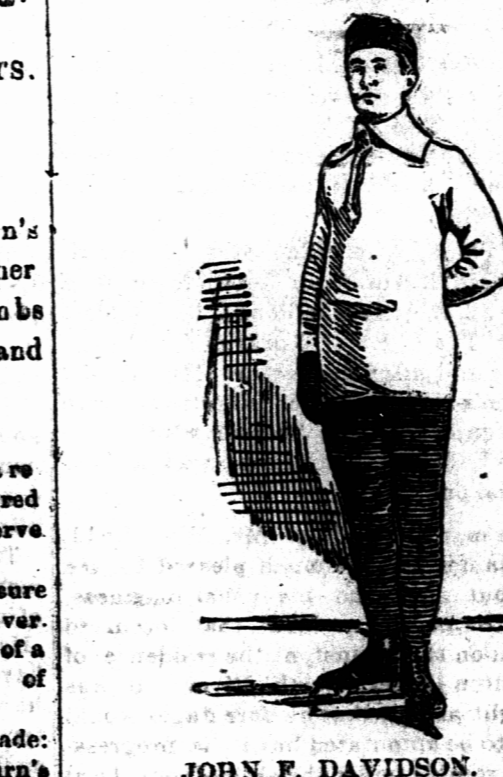
