SHEEP AND LAMBS.

It is to be regretted that the number of sheep on farms in this Province is not increasing proportionately to the profitability of this line of stock-raising.

Many of our farmers have abandoned sheep-raising because of the extra cost of fencing as compared with the days of the rail fence.

Farmers who have specialized in sheep-raising and have introduced the best breeds, find it a very profitable side-line in stock-breeding.

Hogs and lambs are among the most profitable of our live stock, and we do not raise as many of either as we should.

CAN SCIENCE TELL?

The recent destructive hurricane which left a trail of death and destruction in its wake a few days ago in the West Indies, has again raised the question, can science foretell these occurrences sufficiently long in advance to permit of warnings being given, and so prevent the loss of life which usually accompanies them?

While the question is engaging the attention of the scientists, it would appear to dwellers of lands in which such storms never occur, that the thing to do in places subject to periodic storms of the kind referred to is to have hurricane cellars always in readiness.

From what science has achieved in the past few years, he would be a daring prophet who would say that it would be impossible to foretell the coming of a hurricane at least a few hours in advance.

As a result of the meeting of warm and cool air and consequent sudden changes in atmospheric pressure. The lowering of the atmospheric pressure makes a partial vacuum, into which the surrounding air rushes with a velocity proportionate to the measure of the vacuum.

Atmospheric changes are usually very sudden, and the pressure over a given area may change almost in a moment in which case the storm is on without further warning.

This is one of the difficulties with which science must grapple in undertaking to reduce the destructiveness of tropical storms.

There are undoubtedly things that science itself may find it impossible to accomplish. The universe is full of mystery and many of them will remain unrevealed while the universe exists.

The hidden things of today will be the commonplace of tomorrow.

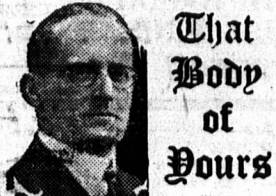
Something new and important to poultry breeders is expected to be announced from the Ontario Agricultural College.

Before the soldiers proceeded overseas they were vaccinated against smallpox and typhoid fever.

Louis Pasteur, the famous chemist of France, was trying to discover some method of preventing chicken cholera.

From this, Pasteur's keen and powerful brain evolved the idea of using a very mild or "thin" vaccine of a disease to prevent the serious or fatal consequences of the disease itself.

"We to-day can scarcely appreciate the debt we owe Pasteur, and to Lord Lister, who put Pasteur's discoveries into practical use in surgery."

Pasteur, of course, is best known to the world by what is known as the Pasteur treatment for rabies or the bite of a mad dog.

By his work he was able to save the silk industry of France, and the wine industry also.

The above are only some of the achievements of this wonderful man, and it is only fitting as we see the great work now done by the health departments of our states, provinces, cities, towns and other communities, that we should give thanks to that one man who, less than seventy years ago, laid the foundations for "the whole edifice of modern hygiene, sanitation, and preventive medicine."
