The end of the pilot ladder was inside the lower boat port forecastle hold door about six feet, when I examined the condition of things. I found the marlin spike lying on the deck one foot from a small line which he had been splicing on the ladder. The ladder was in a position that it would indicate that he was sitting. The man's cap was lying in a passage way almost in the centre of the ship, slightly towards the port side. The cap had a hole through the back of it, in the opinion of the witness, a bullet hole. (Cap produced).

PLEASANT PASSAGE—A cable from Liverpool today advised that Mr. and Mrs. James Paton arrived safely after a pleasant passage.

FIGHT ON THE DOCK

"Come on the dock, and we'll have it out," Anti shouted. Suddenly the boatswain called out, "All right, I'll come," and ran aft to the gangway and thence to the pier. Anti, who had picked up a piece of wood four feet long, and two by two, stood waiting. The boatswain ran right into him. The latter had a knife in his hand. Anti made a swing with the club, while the boatswain made two or three attempts to stab him. Anti ran away up the dock, and the boatswain returned to the ship. Meanwhile the crew had collected and were standing around. After the boatswain got aboard he started his men to work again. He, himself had been working at a pilot's ladder, putting new steps in it, and he too now returned to work. At 9.40 or 9.45 a. m., witness was standing amidships, and saw the two prisoners standing side by side to the starboard side of the saloon deck. The chief officer stated that he walked up to Anti and inquired if he had been stabbed. He replied in the affirmative and the witness couldn't say that it was soon as the latter was unengaged, and show his wounds. Anti had a slight abrasion on the chin, but the witness couldn't say that it was new. He told the prisoners that they did not wish to have any trouble in a foreign port. They replied that they themselves did not wish to have any trouble with the witness nor with the boatswain.

SHOOTING HAD ALREADY OCCURRED

Witness walked up to where the boatswain had been working, calling him as he stepped over the sill of the starboard side, and starting through to the port side through a small dark passage. As he was walking through he stumbled over the boatswain's body. The man was on his right side, half turned over, his knees drawn up. "I got down on one knee and spoke," the chief officer declared.

CHIEF OFFICER

Frederick S. Delano, chief officer of Winding Gulf (sworn) was next cross examined by the attorney-general. Witness stated that he is an American citizen, working on the steamer for five years, had known Roderiques 18 months, and had known Anti, only as a member of the crew. He knew Posselt as one of the men directly under him. The boatswain, stated the witness, came, as was his habit, at 7.45 a. m. on Thursday to receive instructions from him. At 8 o'clock witness went to his pilot house. While there, at 8.20 a. m. he saw the boatswain run down the starboard side of the deck followed by Anti with a bar four feet long, two inches wide, and one-half inch thick, used in connection with the anchor engine. It would weigh eighteen or twenty pounds. Anti appeared to be chasing the boatswain. Witness ran out just as they went past. The boatswain went into the galley. Anti stopped opposite the pilot house and did not go up on the saloon deck. The boatswain came out of the galley with the cook's cleaver and ran past the witness, who attempted to catch hold of him. To get to Anti, he had to go down twelve steps to the well deck. Anti, seeing him with the cleaver, dropped the bar and slid over the side to the dock. The cleaver had a sharp edge, a wooden handle about eight inches long and a blade of the same length. It would weigh about eight pounds. The men were about twenty feet apart when Anti
