**SONS OF TEMPERANCE.**

The Sons of Temperance Record and Prohibition Advocate, the official organ of the Grand Division of Ontario, for June, contains an illustration of the Rev. W. J. Kirby, G. W. P., John Chappell, P. G. W. P., Grand Supt. of Young People's Work, and Ernest Stephen Weeks, G. S., with the following description:

REV. W. J. KIRBY, G. W. P.

Bro. Kirby was born in England some 47 years ago, and educated at Harrow-on-the-Hill, Middlesex, and entered the Wesleyan Methodist ministry. His first connection with organized work was when he joined the British Templars in 1875. He was initiated into the Sons of Temperance in old Fireman's Division, St. John, N. B., in 1878, and in the following year was elected Grand Chaplain. The office of G. Chaplain of P. E. I. has been twice filled, and Bro. Kirby is now serving his second term as G. W. P., the only member holding this distinction. He was G. W. P. in 1893. The M. W. P. has conferred upon him the honor of D. M. W. P. for this Province. In church circles he has held equally prominent positions. His work through the press has been extensive. He is now maritime editor of the Endeavor Banner, of Montreal, and correspondent of some of the leading provincial papers. Temperance and all moral reforms call forth his most intense interest. He has a large pastoral charge, the membership of his church being 120.

JOHN J. CHAPPELL, P. G. W. P.

GRAND SUPT. OF YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK. Born at Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, July 25th, 1847. Initiated into Victoria Division, No. 4, Sons of Temperance, Jan 12th, 1863. Moved to Fairville, New Brunswick, August, 1865, and became a charter member by card of Fairville Division No 182, organized Nov. 22nd, 1865. Returned to Charlottetown and rejoined Victoria Division, by card, Dec. 16th, 1867. Elected Worthy Patriarch of Victoria Division, Oct. 1868. Initiated into the Grand Division of P. E. Island, April 20th, 1869. Elected Grand Scribe of P. E. Island, Oct. 29th, 1875. Elected G. W. Patriarch of P. E. Island, Oct. 17th, 1877. Initiated into the National Division of North America in the City of Buffalo, N. Y., June 18th, 1878. Elected Most Worthy Sentinel of the National Division, June 18th, 1878. Elected Grand Supt. of Young People's Work of the Grand Division of P. E. Island, Nov. 3rd, 1897, and is now serving a second term as Worthy Commander of Company A., Loyal Crusaders, Charlottetown.

ERNEST STEPHEN WEEKS, G. S.

Born at Fredericton, P. E. Island August 30th, 1875, and is the oldest son of John Weeks, Esq., a well-to-do farmer of that place. Educated in country school and Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown. Initiated into the order of the Sons of Temperance, Sept. 19th, 1894, when he became a charter member of "Refuge Division" No. 201. Initiated into the Grand Division of P. E. Island, Nov. 5th, 1896. Elected Grand Sentinel of Grand Division, Nov. 3rd, 1897. Elected Grand Scribe of P. E. Island, Oct. 24th, 1898. Though a young member, Bro. Weeks is elected the successor of our late Bro. Jessie S. Burns, who died in 1898 and was considered a model officer, and was universally esteemed.
