JUNIOR RUGBY DRAWS CROWDS

WINNIPEG, Nov. 25—Winnipeg football interest fired by enthusiasm for a great senior team, Buse Bombers, citizens turned out in the thousands to support high school rugby this season.

In the three-team City Schools division where Martin Gainer and Ole Midgarden of Bombers coached Gordon Bell high school to a championship, crowds of 2,000 to 4,000 watched league games played at night under floodlights at Osborne Stadium.

The Manitoba Schools league on four teams was handicapped by lack of a suitable playing field and crowds there were not as large but the class of football did not suffer. Greg Kabat of Bombers coached St. Paul's College to the title producing one of the best school teams in Winnipeg's history.

A playoff with Gordon Bell was slated but St. Paul's, barely through a gruelling league final, detailed Daniel McIntyre and Kelvin completed the City division with St. John's College, Ravenscourt, both of Winnipeg, and Portage la Prairie in the Manitoba league.

Jack Holt At Capitol
