DOMINION DAY.

Thirty-eight years ago to-morrow "a nation was born in a day," the Dominion of Canada. Let no one cavil over the word "nation"; we have the highest authority for its use in this connection as Canada was thus designated by His Excellency Lord Monck in his speech from the throne at the opening of the first Parliament of the United Provinces. And what is a nation but a great state? The noble Lord who introduced the British North America Bill in the House of Lords had used the words, "We lay today the foundation of a great state which may one day over-shadow even ourselves." Canada has since then made some progress toward the attainment of the proud position contemplated by those who laid the foundation.

"Wider still and wider have her bounds been set." At first there were four Provinces extending from the Atlantic to the head of the five-fold Lakes. Then a great stride westward was taken to the Rocky Mountains. A year later and the boundary was moved on to the far Pacific. Two years later still this island was brought into the great confederacy. More recently all the territory extending northward to the Arctic Ocean and the north pole was included within our broad domain and the entire northern half of the continent was brought under the one central government at Ottawa. The four Provinces became seven, and when the legislation of the present session takes effect the number will be swelled to nine. It is our just pride that throughout the whole there are just laws, administered by incorruptible judges, and orderly government administered in accord with the well understood wishes of a free people.

The Intercolonial Railway was projected and built to bind the original four Provinces together. The Pacific Railway was constructed to give physical connection and communication to the entire

COMMUNICATION COMMENT.

On the matter of the third steamer there need be no disquieting feeling. The new boat every one wants and the Government left with every delegation the impression that it will be forthcoming. But the Tunnel, the saving measure, is what must be advanced. The estimates should contain some item at as early a date as possible to relieve the people's anxiety by assuring a completion and verification of the data at hand and considered sufficient by some contractors at least; then the prosecution of this great work as the only satisfactory system of communication to all concerned and one big with possibilities for the Island and the Dominion.

Let no one become unduly exercised over the steamer. It has got to come, is indeed determined on. What sort of steamer may be left to those who have to examine the premises and take the responsibility. We do not agree with our evening contemporary which avers that it has vouchsafed the only Heaven-inspired advice on this matter, and that the Government is, in the circumstances greatly to be blamed because the new boat cannot be built for next November. There is reason in all things. The memorial and agitation of 1896 only secured the Stanley in 1898, and there is nothing on the record to show that the inspired of today was then in a prophetic mood. We shall not suffer by using due moderation while moderation continues to be a virtue.

The Tunnel agitation has been carefully preserved from the contagion of politics and personal or selfish interests. It has done the Island much good already; it will complete the work, for it must be kept up—everybody is now convinced of that—until its object is secured. In a letter from Ottawa which is before us we read, and print for the benefit of the faint hearted "Hon. Mr. Prefontaine says there is no doubt about the third boat, and that in the meantime the Montcalm or some other boat will be sent to you for next winter."

This assurance with the initiatory steps in the Tunnel project is all that Islanders can immediately expect. It practically promises everything.

Tomorrow, Dominion Day, being a public Holiday no paper will be issued from this office.

A NEW TERROR FOR RUSSIA.

It is ever the unexpected that is happening. Such an event is the mutiny on a Russian battleship, the newest, largest and swiftest of the fleet, warship and a destroyer in the Black Sea, the murder of the officers, the hoisting of the Red Flag of anarchy and the bombardment by these ships of the great commercial city of Odessa. The city has 450,000 inhabitants. It has been set on fire along its entire front, where the custom house, the great docks and warehouses are, and worst of all armed insurgents are resisting the firemen. The mutineers are now desperate men and know that death will be their portion if captured. The Russian Black Sea fleet, all that now remains of the Czar's naval forces, was at the date of yesterday afternoon's despatches hourly expected at Odessa. There is a grave possibility that other mutinies may follow. The situation at this writing is an appalling one, with the only hope based upon the speedy restoration of order by the fleet and armed forces on shore. Russia is suffering a nightmare of horrors scarcely exceeded since the Reign of Terror in France. Our despatches this morning continue the story.
