THE COOK'S CORNER BAKED BEANS (With Tomato Sauce)

4 1/2 cups dried beans 1 tablespoon salt 1 1/2 cup brown sugar 1 teaspoon mustard 1 large can tomatoes 1 medium onion sliced 1/2 pound salt pork

METHOD: Wash beans, drain, and then place in a pan and cover with cold water. Allow to stand overnight. Next day add more water to cover. If necessary, cover...

Combine the salt, brown sugar and mustard with the canned tomatoes and diced onions. Add to the beans. Water may be added, if necessary, to cover the beans.

Scrape the pork and cut gashes in the fat about 1/2 inch apart. Press into the beans, leaving only the rind showing. Cover and bake in a slow oven (275 deg. F.) for six hours. Add more water to the beans as required in order to keep them covered with liquid all during the baking time. The last half hour of baking, remove the cover to allow the pork to brown and the surface of the beans to dry somewhat.

Either of these recipes will yield from 12 to 16 servings.
