CROWN and Bridgework is now rapidly taking the place of partial plates owing to the fact that no part of the roof of the mouth is covered; that broken down teeth can be saved and thereby the cheeks prevented from sinking, and that a much better masticating surface is given than by the most accurately fitting plate. It is so near an approach to the natural teeth that you do not realize it is in your mouth.

When a tooth is so badly broken down that it cannot be filled it can often be restored to usefulness by a crown. Even a strong root can be crowned and made look like a natural tooth and do its work. When a front tooth is badly broken down it can be replaced by an all porcelain or porcelain-faced crown which is so nearly matched in color, size and shape that it cannot be detected from the natural tooth.

FIGURE 2—Shows tooth replaced by a porcelain crown. If only the root is left this crown can be attached in the same manner.

If the tooth is a back one it is completely covered with a gold crown, and hermetically sealed, rendering further decay impossible and the tooth as useful as before decay took place.

Bridgework may be inserted wherever there is a space between two teeth or between two solid roots or a root and tooth.

The following cuts show more clearly where bridgework is applicable

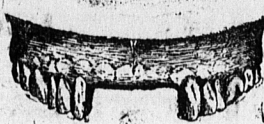


FIGURE 9—Shows four front teeth missing

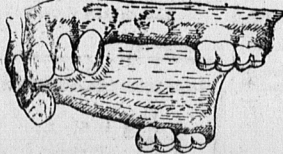


FIGURE 11—Shows the loss of three teeth on each side.

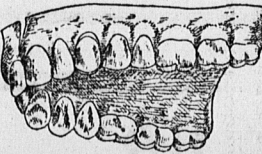


FIGURE 12— Shows the teeth replaced by Bridgework.

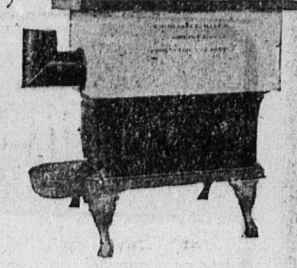
