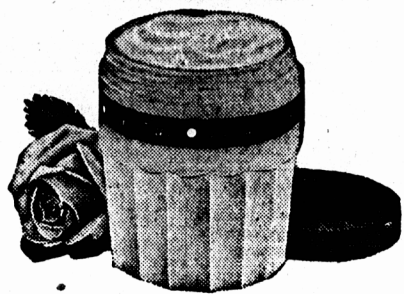

Reminders To Income Taxpayers

Mr. G. E. Ritchie, director of income tax for the Charlottetown district, reminded income taxpayers yesterday that the deadline of April 30th was not far away and that his office was prepared to help taxpayers with their problems provided they did not leave their enquiries until the last week of April.

He advised income taxpayers to be sure they used the form required for their particular circumstances as the use of the wrong form would only delay their final assessment and slow up their tax refunds if they were entitled to any such refund.

He pointed out that salary and wage earners must use one of three forms. Those who had an income of over \$3,000 or investment income of over \$1500 must use the long white form known as the T. 1 General.

Those with incomes less than \$3,000 including investment income of not over \$100, should be careful in making their choice between the shorter white form with the red border on the top known as the T. 1 Special and the new postcard size form known as the T. 1 Employees 1947.

Which form to use can be determined by answering carefully the questions on the back of the postcard size form.

Postcard Form - Mr. Ritchie also pointed out that those entitled to use the postcard form are not required to make payment when they file their return.

The assessment will be made by the Income Tax Department and the taxpayer advised by mail of the amount owing, together with a statement of the tax calculations. At that time, the taxpayer will be given thirty days to make payment of the balance owing, after which the usual penalties will apply.

Those taxpayers using the longer forms, T. 1 General or T. 1 Special, are required to make payment of the balance of the tax owing when they file their return.

Those Canadians engaged in farming have a new form for reporting their 1947 income. This form is specially designed for the farmer of obtaining all the deductions to which he is entitled and will guarantee that he pays only his just and fair share of the income tax.

Mr. Ritchie advised that cash should not be sent through the mails and cheques or postal notes should be made out to the Receiver-General of Canada to assure proper payment. An unsigned return is no return, every taxpayer should take a last glance at his return and make sure it is signed. And last but not least, the deadline is April 30th and penalties must be applied after that date.

TAX QUIZ

Who must file an Income Tax Return by April 30th? Every single person whose total income for 1947 was \$750 or over and every married person whose total income for 1947 was \$1500 or over.

My employer withheld tax from my wages last year. Must I file a return? Yes. You must file a return and establish whether you owe tax or are entitled to a refund.

What is income? Wages, bonuses, commissions, bank interest whether withdrawn or not, dividends, bond interest, rents received, living allowances, the value of free board or lodging given by your employer—in fact everything unless specifically exempt by law.

Where should I file my return? Certainly. All you have to do is file on the long return with the red border on the top, properly known as the T. 1 Special.

Charges U. S. With Lack Of Foresight

Ellis M. Zacharias, retired United States rear admiral and an expert on military intelligence, compared United States failure to be prepared for Communist disruption of the Bogota conference with the similar lack of presence regarding the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, Dec. 7, 1941.

In both cases, he says, there was a failure to properly evaluate ample advance information.

Everyone connected with the dispute over the effectiveness of United States intelligence in the Bogota case, however, seems to me to have overlooked one major point.

Nobody should be going around talking publicly about the work of the intelligence department.

If there is anything wrong, this field is one that, even in a democracy, should be considered in executive session.

As soon as you reveal what agents in Bogota have learned you make it easier for your enemies to trace the informants. Sources are made scarcer and informing more dangerous.

Every foreign counter-intelligence agent avidly watches the developments, studies your system, and moves to protect itself accordingly.

In a case as the current one, fuel is fed to the Communist fire. People everywhere accept foreign spying as proof of evil intent. The Communists will soon have every South American looking under his bed.

The foreign agent in the United States never has to worry that someone at home will issue a statement about his work. His boss doesn't even admit he's here, or that he's anywhere at all, if he has to be reorganized for inefficiency, nothing is said to let the United States know that he failed, much less now.

Counsel Confer On Freight Rates

OTTAWA, April 19 - (GP) - Legal counsel for the seven provinces opposing freight-rate increases went into conference today to determine a course of appeal from the award of a 21-per-cent boost to the railways.

The meeting of the lawyers was preliminary to a conference of the Premiers of the seven provinces - all except Ontario and Quebec - who will gather here Saturday.

It was expected the decision would be to appeal to the Cabinet.

An appeal to the Supreme Court of Canada, the chief alternative, is limited to points of law in the decision of the Board of Transport Commissioners that granted the rate increase. On the other hand, the grounds for an appeal to Cabinet are not limited.

The Cabinet has left the door open for such an appeal, though it has rejected a request of the seven provinces for a stay in the implementation of the higher rates until the appeal could be filed. The new rates went into effect April 8.
