**Must Wade To Waist Unloading In Surf**

HALIFAX, Nov. 16 — (CP) — The department of transport now supervises 3,000 miles of the Nova Scotia coastline.  
 Scattered along this stretch are hundreds of navigational aids. They include: 1,444 buoys, 206 lighthouses; the largest of 1,000-900 candlepower; 47 diaphone fog signals, three explosive signals, 280 wharves, 22 radiophones for isolated lighthouses, three steamers, 20 lighthouses, 28 port ward-

ens, 32 harbor masters and 14 receivers of wrecks.  
 Marine agent Charles Hosterman says many of the department's troubles come in landing supplies from ships on isolated rock piles. They must wade waist-deep in the water carrying supplies in bags and barrels out of the surf onto the crazy ground that surrounds the lighthouses.  
 Shifting sands of Sable Island have already caused two moves for the lighthouse on the western tip. There now are only 20 yards between the light and the ocean and the light will have to be shifted again.

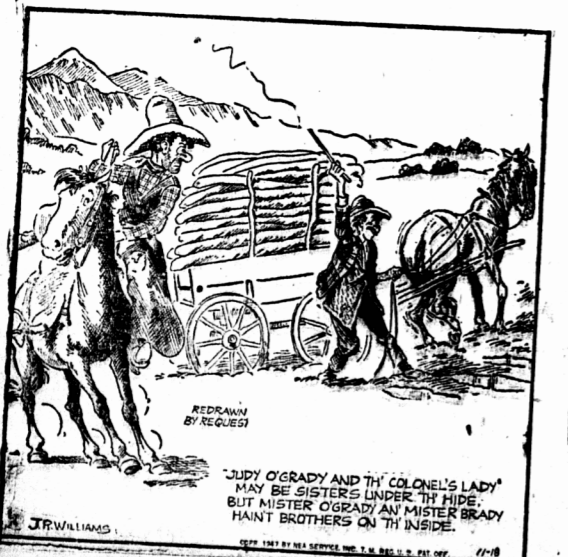

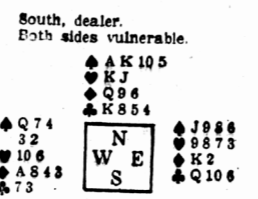

**Contract Bridge**

Concerning "Fancy" Bids

There are many occasions when a "fancy" bid best fits the situation but when such a bid is made, discretion dictates, a "slowing-down" process thereafter. Observe this case:



The bidding:  
 South West North East  
 1♥ Pass 1♠ Pass  
 2♣ Pass 3♦(1) Pass  
 4♠ Pass 5NT(1) Pass  
 Pass Pass 6NT Pass

Even though the club queen was on side and North made four club tricks, he still came out one trick short of his six-notrump contract making only four clubs, five hearts and two spades.

North's "fancy" three-diamond bid was not bad in itself (although there was very little point in it), but his following bidding was inexcusable! Surely it required little

imagination to guess that the three diamond bid had struck good support in South's hand, insofar as diamond length was concerned, but, just as surely, North should have realized that in jumping from four diamonds to five notrump (North-South were not using any slam convention) he would be virtually forcing a diamond slam that he himself could not stand. Then, of course, he could no longer support clubs, but would have to run out to six notrump.  
 It would have been forgivable for North-South to reach a six-club contract, because the duplication in spades was difficult to overcome. The crux, however, was that after North's own "phony" diamond bid, he should have become extra conservative instead of barging ahead even more strongly on the next round.

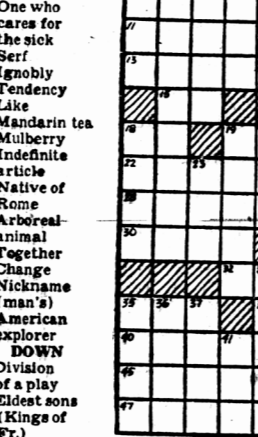

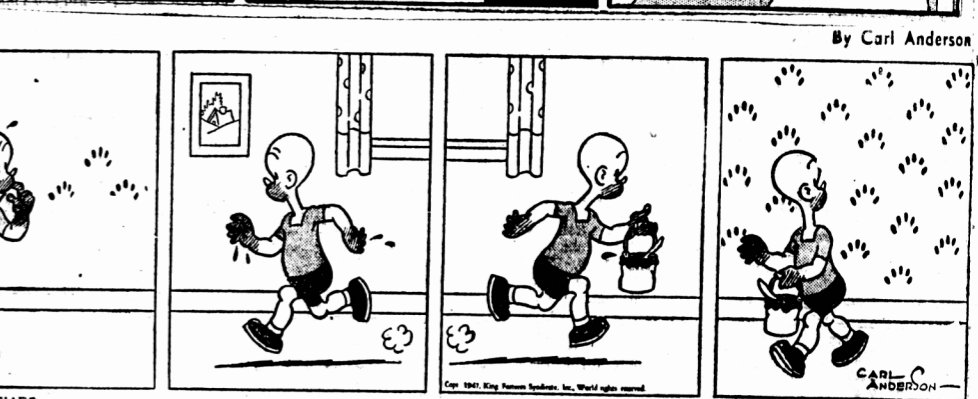
