Profit Taking On New York Stock Market

NEW YORK, March 5 (AP)—Weekend profit taking stemmed the rising tide in Saturday's market and the list closed a shade irregular.

The Associated Press average of 60 issues managed to edge up .1 of a point at 52.4, making the net gain for the week 1.2 points. It was the third consecutive week's advance. Volume of 584,560 shares compared with 783,600 on the previous Saturday.

Canadian securities were generally steady. Gains ranging from 1-8 to 3-4 of a point were scored by Distillers-Seagram, International Nickel, McIntyre, Brazilian, Ford and Imperial Oil. Dome and Lake Shore dipped fractionally.

In the first hour's run-up many stocks touched new highs for the past year, among these were U. S. rubber preferred, American Telephone, Union Pacific, Sears Roebuck, International Harvester, Deere, Caterpillar Tractor, United Fruit and J. C. Penney. Most ended up fractions to a point or so, along with N. Y. Central, Chrysler, Anaconda and Texas Corp.

Aircraft again lagged after their lengthy forward tilt on armament profits hopes. Losers were Douglas, United Aircraft, Sperry, Glen Martin and Boeing.

Lower also were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Montgomery Ward, Philip Morris, Southern Pacific, Du Pont, Consolidated Edison and National Distillers.

MONTEAL, March 5 (CP)—Butter, cheese and eggs prices eased narrowly as light selling appeared on open produce markets here last week, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported.

Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 23-23 1/2 cents a pound and solids for 22 1-2-23 1-4; western butter delivered in Montreal was offered at 22 1-4-22 1-2 for fresh and regraded. Que. No. 1 pasteurized regraded sold for 22 1-8-1-4.

Ontario white and colored cheese brought 11 5-8-3-4 cents a pound.

Graded egg shipments in used free cases sold for 23 cents a dozen for A-large, 22 for A-medium and 21 for A-pullet. Large were offered at 19 and C at 17.

WINNIPEG, March 5 (CP)—Export sales of Canadian wheat estimated around 100,000 bushels was the only feature of a dull session at Winnipeg Saturday as wheat futures prices held firm.

Most of the export business was worked from Vancouver.

Final quotations were unchanged to 1-8 cent lower, with May at 62 3-8, July 63 1-8 and October 63 3-8 cents.

Liverpool closed 1-8-1-4d lower Chicago values moved narrowly in steady trading, finishing 1-4 cent higher to 1-4 cent lower, while Buenos Aires remained unchanged.

Interest in cash wheat and coarse grains was at a minimum.
