Consumer Goods Conference At Federal Capital

### Two Breaks Reported At S' Side Over Week-End

OTTAWA, Jan. 20 (CP)—Review and bringing up to date of the consumer branch of the board to be held in Ottawa starting Monday, Jan. 21. Prince Edward Island will be represented at the conference by Mrs. E. S. Coffin, of Charlottetown, and Miss Byrne Hope Sanders, director of the consumer branch, will preside in the course of the session at which chairman Donald Gordon, deputy chairman E. W. Taylor and M. W. McCutcheon will give addresses, an endeavor will be made to meet the widespread criticism of local and regional shortages of essential consumer goods. The board is getting ready on the question of constant shortages of such articles as children's underwear, men's suits, socks and shirts, bed sheets and pillowcases, rubbers, and thousands and one different kinds of essential household equipment and accessories. Through Chairman Gordon and other officials prices board has announced its orders to private industry to increase their output of these goods and to produce more goods to sell under the present scale of price ceilings.
