STOCK QUOTATIONS

Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Aug. 22 (AP)—A sustained recovery movement was under way in grain futures today. Wheat and corn climbed more than a cent a bushel and rye as much as two cents before prices fell back slightly under profit-taking. Oats were up fractions most of the time.

WINNIPEG, Aug. 22 (CP)—A late rally in the futures sent prices up 1 1/2-2 cents a bushel today on the Winnipeg Grain Ex-change with October closing at \$2.45.

Buyers entered the market near the close, support being offered by locals and commission houses. Ear-lier the market was dull but val-ues held higher in sympathy with Chicago.

No export trade was reported to-day in wheat while the domestic market for coarse grains continued dull.

TORONTO, Aug. 22 (CP)—The mining groups registered fur-ther weakness today on the Toron-to Exchange, particularly in the gold group which was off 81 at the close. Base Metals weakened 24 cents and the Western Oils finished prac-tically unchanged in the average.

After a generally firm opening the gold shares slipped off as the session advanced. Active trading in Buffalo-Canadian and Buffal-ogold on price gains of 4 cents and 4 cents respectively, enlivened the trading.

MONTREAL, Aug. 22 (CP)—Industrials and papers showed nar-row improvement in quiet trading today on the Montreal Stock Ex-change and Cur Market, but aver-ages for other groups were lower. Golds, down 0.67, showed the lar-gest loss.

Most active in the mining section was MacDonald which advanced 27 cents to a new high. Other gainers included Bulois, Contremaque.

Trading box score: 83,500 shares; mines 67,700; industrials 15,800; stocks higher 33, lower 23; unchan-ged 46.

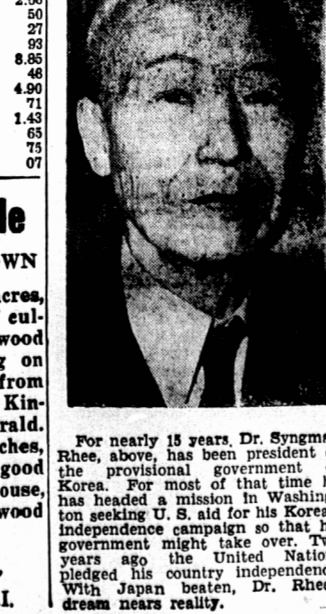
