These cattle are a splendid looking bunch and Messrs Saunders & Newsome are to be congratulated on securing them.

AN EMPTY JAIL.—Mr. Joseph Coyle, keeper of the Queen's County Jail, is to be congratulated on being now able to relax the vigilance incident to his duties, his last boarder having been discharged yesterday after a rest of eight days. Peaceful and lawabiding as the province is, it is yet an unusual thing to have its largest jail empty. Only once before, in its history of a little over a year, has the new Queen's County Jail been empty; this was last summer when there was no inmate for five days. The Guardian is informed that the old jail was empty for one day only in twelve years. Mr. Coyle, while a genial host, is in no way anxious for guests and he is looking forward to a record-breaking intermission now that his house is empty. Since he took charge on the opening of the new jail on April 6th 1912 the largest number of inmates at one time was thirteen. Only one criminal has been accommodated in the new building and he became wearied with his surroundings and left while the jailer was away on a holiday.
