MARITIME PROVINCES SEE NO SIGNS OF DEPRESSION

A compilation of significant business factors indicates that recession was in evidence during June in each of the five economic areas of Canada with the single exception of the Maritime Provinces. The Financial Post says. The index for Canada as a whole had shown a temporary rebound in May and the decline in June was insufficient to counter-balance the gain of the preceding month. The level of business activity measured by this index is lower than in 1928 or 1929 but higher than in 1927 and preceding years. A declining trend has been in evidence for about twelve months, but recently a tendency toward stabilization has put in an appearance suggesting that the next important change may be toward a return of prosperity.
