70, TO WED ON \$15 A MONTH.

MILWAUKEE, July 16.—"A man is never too old to marry," said John J. Duggan, aged 70, as he announced his engagement to Annie Muffet, aged 53 years.

Mr. Duggan secured his license yesterday, and although he says he would like to get it over in a hurry—the quicker the better for him—he will have to wait three weeks until the bans have been published.

It was 62 years ago that Mr. Duggan, then a boy of eight, came to Milwaukee from England. He has resided here practically ever since, excepting the time he has been in the soldiers' homes at Waupaca and Milwaukee.

Now he is looking for a job. "I won't take almost any kind of work I might be getting," he said. "I worked as porter at the Kirby House for over ten years."
