Mr. Morris is a former Charlottetown boy who has been located in the west for over twenty years and is now engaged in the real estate business. Mr. Morris relates many interesting incidents in connection with his experiences in the west since first locating there and it is worthy of note that he built the first house in the now prosperous town of Lacombe. Shortly after going west, Mr. Morris, in company with Murdoch J. McLeod, a brother of Mrs. Dr. Dewar, Southport, established a general store at that place in connection with their fur trading and they have watched the little town develop into a healthy and thriving municipality of 2000 or more inhabitants. Of recent years Mr. Morris has been interested in real estate and now devotes his whole time to that important branch of western commercial life. Mr. McLeod is now conducting a hardware and machine business in the west he does not believe in underating his native province. There are possibilities here he says which, if developed, would tend to improve present conditions and he lays particular stress on the fruit exporting industry. In British Columbia \$500 to \$1000 an acre is paid for fruit land of a quality far inferior to P. E. I. soil which is acknowledged to be well adapted for this purpose. The choice of a good hard apple, a good system of export packing, intensive culture and co-operation are needed to bring forth results in the export of apples and better success can be attained here than in B. C. He says that for its size this province is superior in many ways and other part of the Dominion. He has met many provincialists in the far west and says they can be met in almost any locality.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district, ready to prove, may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, or only son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$10 per acre. Duties. Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to clear homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts at the price \$100 per acre.
