SYNOPSIS OF EVIDENCE OF REDDIN VS SINCLAIR

Stipendiary Magistrate Reddin Asks For Libel Against Rev. R. G. Sinclair For the Writing of a Letter Published in The Guardian Some Time Ago. Several Witnesses Examined and Case Adjourned. The Trial Will Resume Today.

(Special by Telephone.) GEORGETOWN, Dec. 15—The following, in which a great deal of interest is being taken, is a synopsis of the evidence of the case of Reddin vs Sinclair asking for libel.

Mr. Sinclair knew the law was not enforced and he thought the failure was largely due to the prosecutor and Stipendiary. He had a right to make fair comment thereon.

The Magistrate asked whether witnesses were there. They were not. Witness asked for an adjournment which was granted. The adjournment was over eight days. After fourteen days, witness called the Magistrate's attention to the adjournment being too long.
