INFORMATION was received in this City yesterday of the death of Mrs. William Wykes, at St. John's, Nfld. She was formerly of Highfield in this Province. Her death occurred yesterday. She was aged 62 years.

ANOTHER day has passed and those who are looking out for Jere McAuliffe and his company to begin their engagement in the Opera House have had to resign themselves to the unavoidable delay occasioned by the steamer being blockaded in Pictou. It is not known when the company will arrive, but there is a possibility that today may give the boat a chance to cross, in which case the company will appear tonight.

BECAUSE of the boats not crossing yesterday the Abegweit Hockey team is still detained at Pictou, but they will probably reach home today. The final league game scheduled for tonight has consequently been postponed to Friday night next and the carnival to be held on that night has been postponed to Tuesday night, March 5th. This will give more time for skaters to prepare their costumes for the last and best carnival.

J. K. Ross began a course of instruction on the subject of Life Insurance before the students of the Charlottetown Business College last night. He was greeted with a large attendance of students who for upwards of an hour were thoroughly interested as he took them from point to point in the great subject—insurance. Mr. Ross began by giving the students some splendid advice on success qualifications and opened his subject by asking—what is life insurance. His talk and explanations are but preparatory to the course to follow.

THE winter steamers yesterday remained as they were the day before—the Stanley in Pictou, finding it impossible to leave on account of the heavy ice and the snow, and the Minto stuck in the ice near Cape Bear. A change of the weather will have to occur before the blockade can be raised, but this may happen suddenly. The snowstorm which prevailed to a greater or less extent in the Straits yesterday is now probably ended, and with a clear atmosphere there will probably be a likelihood of the steamers making a move.

The largest audience that has attended any of the special Evangelistic services was present last evening. Rev. G. R. White gave a very strong address on Sin what it is and what it does. Rev. Mr. Robertson followed up with a strong appeal giving the remedy for Sin as found in Jesus Christ. Those who wished to turn from Sin to Christ were asked to stand and afterward retire to the enquiry room. Seven persons, among them two stalwart young men, signed cards declaring themselves on the side of Christ. There will be a Ladies' meeting in Zion Church today at 3.30 in the Ladies' parlour for prayer for the meetings; all ladies are invited. As this is the regular meeting of the other churches have been given up for the present, there will undoubtedly be a crowded house tonight. These meetings are for all.

It now transpires that the Harry Burns, about whom information was asked some time ago in The Guardian was a son of the late James Burns, who was for many years warehouse man for the shipping firm of Welsh & Owen in this City. James Burns will be well remembered by many of the grown-up people of Charlottetown, for there were very few in Charlottetown who were not acquainted with "big Jim" as he was familiarly called. He was part and parcel of the well-known firm with which he was employed, and which twenty or thirty years ago did a big business in Charlottetown. It will be remembered that the fact of Harry Burns' death, supposed by violence, was brought to The Guardian's attention by W. K. Rogers, Grand Master of the Free Masons of this City, he having received a communication from the Grand Master of the Free Masons in Seattle, where Burns' death took place. Burns, as far as The Guardian could learn at night, had been out there for some years past. He formerly went to sea. His identity is fixed by a later telegram received yesterday by Mr. Rogers. The dead man was a nephew of John Burns of this City.
