STIRRING ROMANTIC DRAMA OPENS AT CAPITOL THEATRE

A rare and exciting glimpse back into the glitter of yesterday awaits those moviegoers who visit the Capitol Theatre, Summerside, where Warner Bros. hardboiled and suspenseful new drama, "Her Kind of Man," opened last night. Starring a trio of bright young screen newcomers, Dane Clark, Janis Paige and Zachary Scott, the film is a graphic and moving portrayal of the life of an arch villain, as meretricious as the times in which he lived—and as doomed to oblivion. Basically as much a portrait of the late Twenties as it is the individual story of Steve Maddox (Zachary Scott), the picture picks up the threads of Steve's life at a point where social extravagances have reached their peak, where speakeasy peepholes confront a restless society at every turning, where reckless living is the keynote of the hour. Paced with an effort of steady employment in the Chicago night club owned by his sister (Faye Emerson) and her husband (George Tobias), Steve declines in favor of the more exciting prospect of gambling his way quickly to the top. Nor does he heed the entreaties of his beautiful sweetheart, Georgia King (Janis Paige), torch-singer in Joe's club, to bridle his talents to the slower—but surer—way of honest hard work. Steve does cash in, to the tune of \$50,000, but with the acquisition of riches he takes an irrevocable plunge into the false glitter that surrounds him and it is not long before the gaudy times and the gaudy man are indistinguishable.

President J. E. Dalton presided at the regular meeting and Dr. G. K. Gunn, pathologist and superintendent of the Dominion Government Experimental Fox Ranch was the guest speaker. A daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel W. Squarebriggs, now of Maple Hills, Charlottetown, the late Miss Squarebriggs lived in Summerside all her life till nine months ago when she moved to Montreal, before leaving here she was employed in the MacQuarrie Beauty Parlor. Besides her parents she is survived by three brothers and one sister: Reginald, Summerside; Sterling and Austin in Charlottetown and Edith in Montreal. Plan To Reclaim Marshes In N. S.

HALIFAX, April 30 (CP)—A bill, which would make possible the reclamation of 30,000 acres of Nova Scotia marshland now is before the Dominion Cabinet, said Waldo Walsh, Deputy Agriculture Minister, told the Legislature's agriculture committee today. Mr. Walsh said that, with the Province importing more than \$15,000,000 worth of food annually, every acre of land was needed and the proposed federal assistance would enable dykeland owners, also aided by the Provincial Government, to initiate a long-term policy of reclamation. Agriculture Minister MacKenzie announced in the Legislature April 24 the Government was expecting assistance from Federal authorities in land reclamation and rebuilding of dykes. He said at that time, the problem was too big a proposition for Nova Scotia to undertake as a Province and Federal legislation similar in scope to the Prairie Farmers' Rehabilitation Act—which provides for irrigation aids—was expected. D.D. Sutton (L-Kings) claimed the project would result in doubled production of beef in Nova Scotia. He suggested that if the Federal Government did not give the aid, a separate department should be set up to divert all taxes from the marshlands area into a program of rehabilitation.
