Doctors Exhorted In Papal Address

ROME, Nov. 14 (CP-Reuters) Pope Pius XII declared today that no power on earth has authority to take human life except in execution of a death sentence against a guilty person.

His Holiness was granting an audience to 800 members of Saint Luke's Association of Catholic Medical Practitioners. 'Any act tending directly to destroy an innocent human being is a crime, whether it be a means towards that end, whether that life is embryonic or fully grown, or nearing its end, is forbidden,' he said.

Exhorting doctors to uphold sexual standards and affirming that the primary ruling purpose of sexual energies is the procreation and upbringing of children, the Pope said 'young men under the influence of growing passions, or engaged couples awaiting marriage, often have recourse to a doctor asking for advice and hoping to obtain it along a contrary to nature and honor.'

'All possible arguments of medical science and social morals will be brought to bear in the hope of inducing a doctor to give advice or aid calculated to assist the patient in natural means in a manner frustrating the purpose of vital generative forces.'

He is personally convinced that the divine purpose will resist these assaults.

Ask Radio Stations To Pay More For Copyright Music

OTTAWA, Nov. 15 (CP) - Increased rates for the use of copyright music by radio stations is asked by the Canadian Performing Rights Society in a scheduled meeting of the Secretary General and published in the Ottawa Gazette.

Broadcast Music Incorporated, Canada, Dept. of Industry, presses readiness to stand by the 1944 rates, but says if there is to be a change it will be in the quarter of the total amount paid by radio stations. The American Performing Rights Society, which first entered the field last year, asked for increased rates.

OTTAWA, Nov. 15 (CP) - Quebec has more 1944 draftees in the Home Defence Army than any other province, it was disclosed today in a report by the Defence Minister McNaughton.

Patrie districts were second with 1,700 and behind came Ontario with 900; the Maritimes with 400 and British Columbia and Pacific Command with 300. The total number of 'originals' still in Home Defence Service is 6,200.

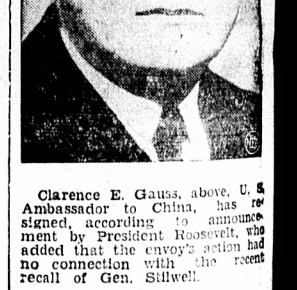

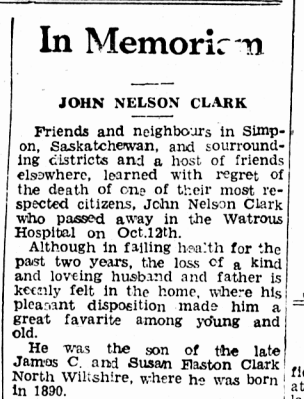

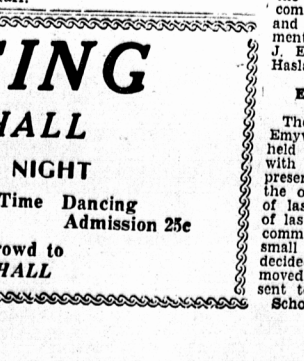
