HORSE NOTES.

The three year old trotting stallion George Cresceus (2.27) that was a winner at Halifax and Charlottetown was bred by George Ketchum, breeder of his sire, and the colt's name is a combination of that of his sire and the given name of his breeder. Mr. Beals of Charlottetown, his owner, bought him at auction when a yearling, and he has been developed by the capable Provincial trainer, Fred Cameron, who last year won the two year old race at Halifax with him. I was privileged to see his sire win the memorable \$20,000 stallion race at Readville eight years ago and if the mental photograph I retain of Cresceus is a true one, George Cresceus is a chip of the old block. The son is perhaps a shade darker than his sire but the head and neck and the way they are carried are very much alike. The son has the determined way of going, though hardly so big gaited. I think barring accident he should develop into a very fast horse. Only one three year old has ever beaten George Cresceus' time on one of our Island tracks and that was in a race for aged horses at Moosepath Park by the North of Boston speedily trotter Tom Phair, when owned by J. A. Johnson. His time in a class was 2.26 1/2. American Horse Breeder.

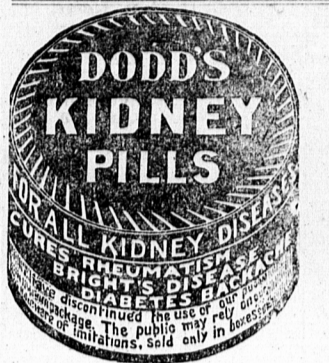

POLITICAL PURITY IN THE ELECTION

1. We shall conduct a campaign of education by having addresses made at public meetings, sermons preached and distributing pamphlets on the duties of citizenship;
(2) We shall prosecute any violators of the law and will employ a force of detectives to work throughout the country;
(3) We have decided to raise a fund sufficient to carry on the above work.
We call upon all citizens to believe in our earnestness in this matter and to support us in our efforts to cure the cancerous condition of our politics. We urge all electors to treat this matter seriously and not allow themselves to come within the potential cause of the Dominion Election Act. Other constituencies have been able to free themselves from this great evil and we mean to adopt the methods which have been successful elsewhere. It is no light matter when our citizenship is made a matter of barter and is thus dishonored. It is no light evil when the honest voters are defrauded of their due influence on the Government of the country. When the political managers use funds and liquor to debauch the electorate.
4. It is the object of the League to secure pledges against all forms of bribery and corruption on the part of the candidates, party workers and as many as possible of the electorate throughout the Province.
The Charlottetown Branch of the League is working Queen's County in the coming Dominion Election and urgently solicit the active co-operation of all good men in our work. A. W. Sterns is the treasurer of the League and will be pleased to receive contributions from over the country. A statement will be forwarded at the close of the campaign to each contributor showing how every dollar is spent. 10-19drft.

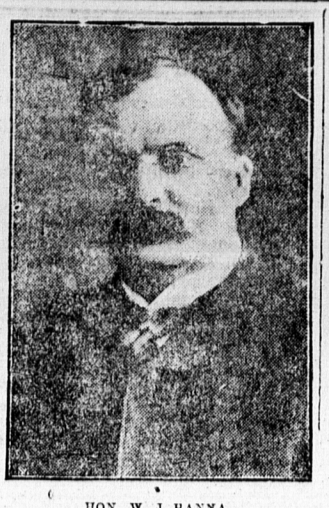

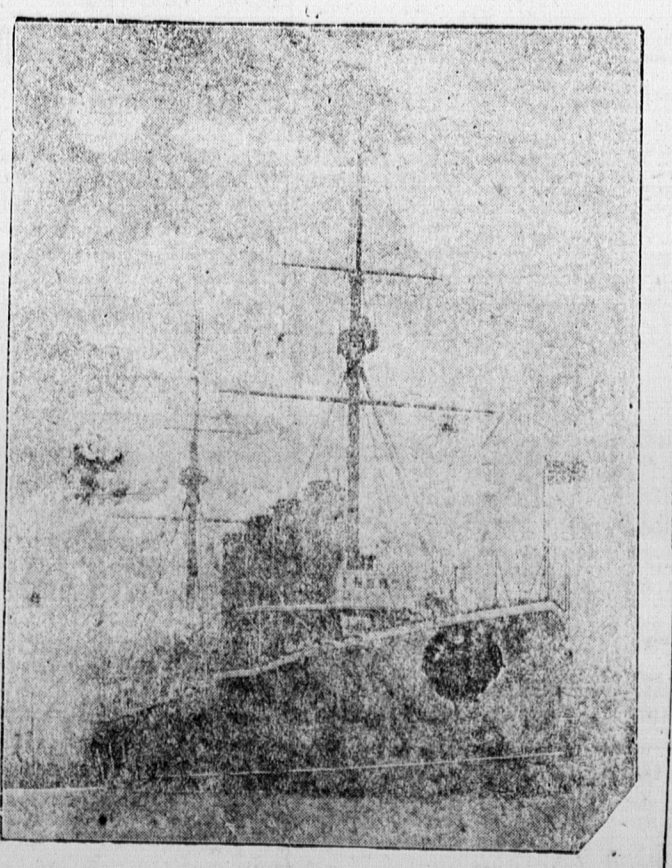
