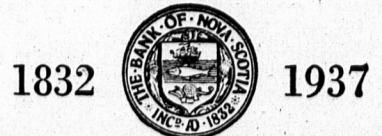

MONTREAL, Dec. 6 (CP)—Hog prices opened 15 cents higher in early livestock dealings today while other divisions moved steadily at unchanged levels.

Receipts: Cattle 1,133; calves, sheep and lambs 1,130; hogs 1,982.

Medium good steers brought around \$6 while mediums made \$5.50 with common kinds from \$4 to \$4.75.

Good veal calves sold at \$9.50 with medium goods up to \$9.25 and fat to mediums from \$8 to \$8.50.

On lamb section good ewes and wethers brought \$8 with lambs weighing 100 pounds or more at \$6 and culls and backs at \$7.

Bacon hogs, fed and watered, made \$8.50 with selects at the usual \$1 premium and the regular cuts on off grades. Sows went from \$6 to \$7.

FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

TORONTO, Dec. 6—Okalta—Calgary Wires—Okalta Oils, pioneer company in Turner Valley will drill two new wells in the southwest flank of Turner Valley. Okalta No. 7 and No. 8 will be located about due south of the most southern crude producer 1-850 barrel Brown No. 1. Akalta No. 6 located a mile and a half west of the present crude producers, is drilling below 3,000 feet.

Mosher—Has been a strong spot on unlisted past few days as unofficially understand negotiations under way with the Elmos Gold Mines interests but have heard nothing definite at all as to what arrangements may possibly be made. It is believed, however, that this would call for joint development of the northern claims of both companies.

TORONTO, Dec. 6—Home Oil—Exclusive of cash set aside for immediate development program and entirely ignoring speculative share holdings, Home Oil has liquid assets of approximately \$1.28 per share. This calculation is based on official information that company holds government and other good grade bonds to amount of \$1,125,000. In addition company holds 20,000 Royalite, 20,000 shares of Blarione and 4700 shares Pioneer.

TORONTO, Dec. 6—Noranda—Even though there may be some recession in earnings in Noranda for the fourth quarter compared with \$1.21 for similar period for 1936 total earnings for the year will show a wide margin over the \$3.25 a share to be disbursed in dividends this year. Nine months net \$3.29 a share were more than sufficient to cover the full year's payments.

NEW YORK, Dec. 6—Under-tone of market fairly good with volume indications favorable but doubt if market will make much progress today on the upside.

TORONTO, Dec. 6—Moffatt Hall—Directors of recommendation of Messrs. James and Bufman, mining consultants, have authorized diamond drilling on the company's property immediately adjoining Biggood Kirkland, to explore at shallow depths three showings indicated by surface exploration during the past summer.

Macassa—November production \$130,917 from 8,215 tons against \$128,302 in October, 131,839 in Sept. and \$135,690 in August.

Pioneer—Gross production in November \$174,000 against \$184,000 in previous month and \$177,000 for November 1936. Expenses for the period totalled \$79,060 leaving net before depreciation, depletion and taxes at \$95,000 against \$104,000 in October and \$100,000 in November 1936.

MONTREAL, Dec. 6—Distillers Seagram—For first quarter ended October earned \$1.25 on common against \$1.07 in the same quarter last year.

Dominion Stores—Sales in November were off 3.4 per cent as compared with November last year. In October a gain of 2.65 per cent was shown.

Dividend Payments—For November up sharply at \$8,900,000 against \$4,700,000 in November last year. For 11 months total was \$228,500,000 as compared with \$183,000,000.

Buffalo Ankerite—November output at \$245,300 was down from \$254,966 in October, mills milled being 29,307 and 31,018 respectively.

NEW YORK, Dec. 6 (AP)—Raw sugar was unchanged today. No sales were reported. Spots were quoted at 3.35 on the basis of last sales and futures at 3.30.

TORONTO, Dec. 6 (CP)—Prices advanced on the Toronto market today in the heaviest trading since Oct. 19 and the bulk of the gains were intact at the close.

Of the senior golds, Dome alone registered a change, adding a fraction and in the secondary group heavy traders at gains of 5 to 12 cents were Central Pacific, Macleod-Cook-Shum, O'Brien, Omega, Pamour, Paymaster, Pickle Crow, Premier, Preston, San Antonio and Towagmac.

Leading base metals closed higher, including Noranda, Falconbridge, Pend Oreille, Sudbury Basin and Ventures, Falconbridge, and Ventures firmed 45 to 50 cents.

Medium-price western oils were strong from the opening and they readily absorbed considerable profit-taking around the noon period. Royalite was the only important exception to the upward movement, closing nearly two points lower.

Grain Prices

WINNIPEG, Dec. 6 (CP)—Increasingly dull outlook of the Argentine crop situation and sharp advance of wheat at Buenos Aires supplied strength higher on the futures two cents exchange.

Values closed near the top-levels despite easiness in cash prices and a small export business of about 150,000 bushels. Closing quotations were 2 1/2-2 higher, Dec. at \$1.19-1-2, May \$1.16-1-8-1-4 and July \$1.11-7-8-11-12.

Trading generally was dull and featureless with early price gains being posted in opening minutes on scattered export and commission house buying. Offerings throughout were very light.

A light export demand for two and three northern grades failed to keep cash price steady. No. 1 closed 3 cents lower at 17 cents above the Dec. future. No. 2 eased a cent at 12 above the Dec. future. Other grades were unchanged to one cent down.

Coarse grain futures firm. Rye advanced 1 7-8-1 cent to show the biggest gain.
