# SHERWOOD CEMETERY

(Written for The Saturday Guardian, by Henry Smith Charlottetown.)

The old Protestant Burial Ground at the entrance of the Malpeque Road in the Common of Charlottetown, was, by an act of the General Assembly of this Province, closed on the first day of January 1874, and after that date no further burials were allowed therein. This act further provided that no cemetery or burial place should be opened within two miles of the boundaries of the city of Charlottetown.

This made it absolutely necessary for the Protestant portion of the community to procure a place in which to bury their dead outside of these prescribed limits. An act of the Legislature was therefore passed incorporating sundry persons therein named and others, who should from time to time become shareholders, a body corporate under the name of the Charlottetown Cemetery Company.

This name was afterwards by an amendment to the act of incorporation changed to the Sherwood Cemetery Company. The first meeting of the company was held 16th, July, 1872, when the following directors were elected—  
Hon. Judge Young, G. R. Beer, Wm. Cundall, J. W. Morrison, Thom-

As Alley, F. W. Hales, and John Ings.  
In August 1872 the company purchased Sherwood farm from Thomas Cook, and set apart about fifteen acres of it at the junction of the Brackley Point and Royalty Roads, as the most suitable place for a burial ground. This they named "Mount Sherwood Cemetery." These grounds were tastefully laid out into plots, drives and walks. Burial plots were also allotted to the different shareholders in the proportion of one lot for each share.  
On the 10th of January 1874 the first grave was opened in the cemetery for Thomas Preedy, a well known resident of Charlottetown who was buried the following day. He was the father of Mrs. Roome of this city.  
During the thirty three years that have passed since this first interment many of the men who a generation ago were prominent in the different walks of life "have laid them down in their last sleep." A study of the inscriptions on the monuments and tombstones in the cemetery recall many of the persons who played an important part in making the history of the time in which they lived.  
A large granite shaft "erected by the President, Directors and company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island of which he was, for twenty years the cashier, as a token of regard and esteem", marks the last resting place of William Cundall, the first cemetery director buried in Sherwood. He died on the 18th of May, 1876. For half a century Mr. Cundall was a prominent figure in the life of Prince Edward Island. He was a fine type of the English gentleman and this Province is what it is today because men of the stamp and character of William Cundall lived and labored among her people.  
"Earth would never touch her were one in fifty such as he."  
Not far from Mr. Cundall's tombstone is a large marble monument in the form of a cross "erected in memory of Henry Wosley Bayfield, an admiral in Her Majesty's Royal Navy." Admiral Bayfield spent many years of his life in Charlottetown where he was known as a man of supreme honor and integrity. He died in February 1885 at the age of ninety years.  
Among the public men of the past generation who are buried in Sherwood Cemetery may be mentioned Sir Robert Hodgson, who died in December, 1880. He was first elected to the House of Assembly in 1824, and for upwards of fifty years filled several of the important positions in the colony, including that of Chief Justice. Upon this Island entering Confederation Sir Robert Hodgson was appointed Lieutenant Governor of the Province. He was the first native Islander raised to that honorable position.  
The monument of the Honorable John Hamilton Gray, one of the Fathers of Confederation and at one time Premier of Prince Edward Island stands in the west corner of the cemetery. Col. Gray was born in Charlottetown in 1811. When quite a young man he joined the British Army where he won distinction and attained the rank of Colonel.  
After fifty years of active service he returned to his native land. He resided at "Kerman" in the Royalty of Charlottetown, until his death in August, 1887.  
A large monument erected to the memory of the Honorable George Beer recalls the familiar form of one whom the writer knew from earliest childhood—He was a man of considerable ability and always took an active part in the public affairs of the colony. He died in 1872 and was buried in the old Protestant burial ground. After Sherwood Cemetery was opened, his remains were removed and placed in one of the plots in the section chosen by the family in the new cemetery. Four of his sons

George R. Beer, Henry Beer, Frank D. Beer, M. D., and Lemuel L. Beer have since been laid to rest in the burial place of their father. They were all worthy sons of a good man. Henry Beer was for several years a member of the Legislature and Speaker of the Assembly, and at the time of his death was Mayor of the City of Charlottetown. George R. Beer and Lemuel L. Beer both served at different times as City Councilors or the City of Charlottetown and were always willing to take their share of public responsibility when called upon by their fellow citizens to do so.  
Chief Justice Palmer, who died in November, 1889, is buried in Sherwood. He was for many years an important factor in the political life of Prince Edward Island. In 1835 at the age of twenty six he was elected to represent Charlottetown in the House of Assembly which position he held for twenty-five years. He was also for several years a member of the Legislative Council, Attorney General and Premier. In 1874, when he was appointed Chief Justice of Prince Edward Island and until his death he discharged the duties of that honorable position with marked ability.  
Not far from the resting place of the late Chief Justice may be found the monument of Judge Alley who died in May, 1899. For twenty years he was Judge of the County Court of Queens County having been appointed to that position in 1874. As a Judge he had few equals and as a friend he was warm-hearted and true. Judge Alley took an active interest in the affairs of Sherwood Cemetery and for several years was a member of the board of directors. Under his supervision numbers of trees were planted in the cemetery and the work of improvement to the grounds commenced by him nearly twenty years ago has been continued by his successors in office down to the present time.  
The Hon. Charles Young Judge of Probate for Prince Edward Island has a fine granite monument erected to his memory. Judge Young was for several years President of the Legislative Council and Attorney General of the colony. He was also administrator of the Government of Prince Edward Island.
