Pick a Peck of Peppers From Victory Garden Row

Sweet peppers, the large mild flavored kind that turn from green to red or orange as they ripen, are among the richest garden vegetables in vitamins A and C.

They are easily grown in Victory gardens and should be used as much as possible both raw and cooked. They are excellent in bowls, salads, and there are many ways to cook them: one of the best being to stuff them with chopped meat or meat substitute.

Early varieties can be grown from seed sown outdoors, after the ground warms up, but it is better to start plants indoors or buy them in the market. The plants are very tender, and should not be set out until it is safe for tomatoes. Space the plants 18 inches apart in the row and give them frequent watering. They like rich, heavy soil, but thrive in lighter soils if given plenty of water. The pepper is one plant which like a bath now and then it can be washed off with the hose and will thrive the better for it.

They grow rapidly and once they begin to bear they continue to produce fruit until frost kills the plants in the fall. A dozen plants will usually be sufficient for a family of four. They have a long season during which they are in good condition; the color changes from green to red and the vitamin A content increases with this change. The red peppers are highly decorative, and there are also attractive orange varieties.

The only insect likely to attack peppers is a flea beetle, which can be discouraged by spraying or dusting with nicotine sulphate. There are no diseases likely to bother them, but if you wish to try them the same general cultural methods will suffice.

of their entry into Amsterdam many Dutch civilians came forward to help them. Field Marshal Johannes von Blaskowitz, commander of the northern Rhine army group, was known to have ordered men of the "Sickert's Division" (the spy ring) to surrender to the Canadians in the normal way. It was also known that most of them, if not all, were guilty of war crimes, and that many of them had issued false paybooks to themselves and disappeared.

Disguised As Nurses A large number of these, including officers, were arrested during the first few days. Four women among them were found working as nurses in the hospital—they had been provided with Red Cross pay-books. Officials of the Red Cross later were summoned to a conference to discuss supplies and treatment of the sick and it was noticed that some of them were behaving suspiciously. Investigation revealed that they also were members of the ring.

A Dutch woman present suggested that other Germans should be summoned to the conference in place of the spies. When the new batch of Germans arrived they, too, were found to be part of the spy organization. They quickly found themselves in the cells. Three agents of Dutch nationality caught together with their full equipment told of their work after the war. Dutch civilians were induced to enter the spy ring by being threatened with deportation for foreign labor.

Nazi Spy Ring Planned in Holland AMSTERDAM, May 26 - (Reuters) Radio transmitters hidden behind the walls of Dutch houses and under floors, forged paybooks, and a carefully-laid plan to enroll traitors in their cause are among discoveries made by Canadian security officers who are laying bare German preparations made for spying activities in Holland to go on even after the war in Europe.

A combined intelligence and terror system was run by the German security service, the Dutch apparatus after the war in order to carry on the system in peace time. Canadian security service men started work at once. On the day

11 Dead, 52 Injured In Explosion

EDGEWOOD ARSENAL, Md., May 25 (AP) - A terrific explosion that wrecked two buildings caused the deaths of 11 persons and injuries to 52 who were engaged in assembling and loading two-pound igniter hand grenades at the Army's Chemical Warfare Service Headquarters today.

Maj. John D. McPherson, chief of the Edgewood Arsenal Production Division, said that about 185 workers were engaged in the two structures preparing the so-called "balls of flame" that serve as igniters for incendiary gas tanks now being dropped from bombers on Japanese targets.

Ignoring danger to themselves from recurring explosions on all sides, volunteers formed brigades, rushing into the buildings to begin passing out unexploded phosphorus bombs in buckets.
