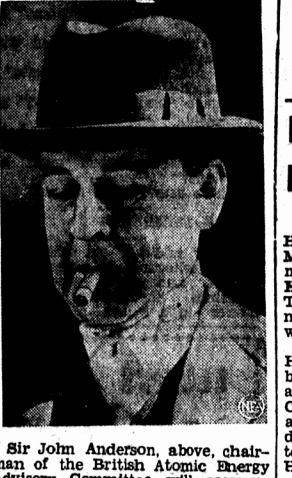
Britain To Suspend Civil Defence Acts
