A GIGANTIC STEEL TRUST TO CONTROL WORLD'S MARKETS.

A Montreal Report that an English Company Will Combine With the Dominion and Nova Scotia Steel Companies.

MONTREAL, Aug. 5.—The Herald publishes the following, which could not be confirmed as Messrs. Ross, Angus and Forgel left to-day for Sydney:—

The Hon. Senator G. A. Cox, who had just returned from England, and Mr. James Ross, the managing director of the Dominion Iron and Steel Co'y, who has just come back from Cape Breton had a conference this afternoon at the offices of the Dominion Coal Company, in the Street Railway building and a question of momentous importance regarding the future of the allied Steel and Coal Companies was discussed.

It is understood the subject of their deliberations was nothing less than the formation of a gigantic British-Canadian steel combination, which will enter into competition with the Steel Trust, not alone for the control of the steel market of the world, but for the production of manufactured steel products cheaper than ever they were produced before.

The Dominion Steel Co'y and the Nova Scotia Steel Co'y are the Canadian factors in this combination; but the most important factor is a well-known English corporation which has work established in all the principal English mining areas in the Midlands, in Lan-

cashire, and in South Wales.

This corporation, whose name is withheld from publication at the moment for tactical reasons, stands in influence and prestige second to none in the British Isles. It was part of the mission of Senator Cox to the Old Country to confer with the principals of the great undertaking and it is understood that matters have reached a position which renders a powerful combination a probability of the near future. It is not easy at the present to get the steel directors together to take up a question of this magnitude, but it is not entirely new to the boards of either the Steel or Coal Company for representatives of the British corporation have been over the works of both the Steel Companies mentioned.

The one difficulty which at the moment stands in the way of carrying through this gigantic amalgamation is the valuation of the respective concerns, whose properties would form a trust. The value placed upon the English undertaking is very considerably higher than that of the two Canadian companies put together. It is the central organization of diversified industries which in the different parts of England named produce machinery and other products from crude steel and iron.
