NEW YORK, Jan. 12—European news this morning seems to be a little better, resulting in higher prices in London, international issues are also firmer. However, there is no improvement in the view of the failure of news to improve concerning the automobile situation we would look for a firm and irregular market today. The price advance in the price of domestic copper yesterday to 12 1/2 cents should stimulate further interest in the copper shares. Four major oil companies have not followed lead by Continental as of January 4 but the oils are acting fairly well. Dividend meetings scheduled for today are Procter and Gamble and Nash-Kelvinator. Stocks which we would favor are General Electric, Westinghouse, Anaconda, Kennecott, American Radiator, Nash-Kelvinator, Remington Rand, Commercial Solvents, Great Northern Pfd., Southern Railway Pfd., General Railway Signal, American Brake Shoe and Goodrich.

Beauharnois Power Corp.—According to Financial Counsel advance attributed to a current report that the New York Central Railway was planning to electrify its line. It was surmised that Beauharnois had been approached in regard to the supply of power. Inquiries from officials brought the reply that the subject had not been broached.

MacLeod Cocksutt—Reports that out of 402,000 treasury shares offered stockholders at \$3 all but 5,000 shares will be taken up and payment made to the treasury. Directors will deal with this small unsubscribed amount.

Leitch—New vein recently encountered on fifth level at Leitch located in Beardmore area, has now been drilled on for a distance of 55 feet south of shaft, with average values of \$31.50 across 11 inches according to word received yesterday by Karl Springer, President. Full capacity of mill is 75 tons daily but production on 50 ton basis is planned until mill is broken in and definite calculation of mill head values is arrived at.

Bacon hogs, fed and watered, made \$8.75 with \$1 premium on select. Butchers, heavies and lights were \$8.25, extra heavies \$7.75, sows \$6 to \$7.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, Jan. 12—(CP)—Reports of plans afoot in Great Britain to accumulate food reserves in the event of war did much to stimulate grain rallies in wheat prices.

The close was 1-2 cent lower to unchanged, May at \$1.28 1-8, July \$1.23 1-8 and October \$1.12 1-4. Prior to the pre-closing recovery movement, selling induced by a lessening of political tension abroad had sent prices more than 1 1/2 cents lower.

Helpful to the reaction also was a pick-up in Canadian wheat export sales.

Interest in high grades of wheat enlivened cash-grains trading. May barley advanced to a season's high price of 85 1-4 cents to highlight operations in coarse grains, where the trend closely followed that of wheat. Barley was up more than two cents.

Produce Prices

MONTREAL, Jan. 12—(CP)—Prices held firm on Montreal open produce markets today with trading comparatively light.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were quoted at 26 to 28 1-2 cents a dozen for A-large, 24 to 26 for A-medium and 23 for A-pullets.

Butter was quoted at 26 3-4 to 27 cents per pound for cartons or less of No. 1 while lots to retailers were 27 1-2 for solids and 28 for prints. Cheese was quoted at 13 to 13 1-4 cents per pound for Ontario while Quebecs were unquoted.

TORONTO, Jan. 12—(CP)—The mining market had sinking spells at times today but it gathered vigor as the session advanced and at the close prices were up in all groups. O'Brien continued to trade in quantity, closing at 9.75 for a net gain of 5 cents. The last hour saw Chibougamau run up a gain of 23 cents to 2.35 and Pickle Crow reached a new high at 8.20, closing at 8.65 for a net gain of 30 cents. Towagmac gained 15 cents, Rendocour 12, McKenzie 12 and Francoeur 12. Sherritt advanced to 3.60, its best price in years and held a rise of 24 cents at 3.40. Coast Copper sold up 60 cents to 7.50, and Hudson Bay 1-4 to a new high at 25 3-4. Leaders in the oils were Dalhousie and Pothills with gains of 10 to 20 cents each.
