Favors Halifax or Sydney for Terminal

OF ATLANTIC SERVICE.

Quick Time Can be Made—Robbery and Murder in Manitoba.

THE CANADIAN EAST LINE.

MONTREAL, Nov. 26.—(Special.)—Robert Reford declares the long railway journey would not seriously interfere with the plan to make Halifax or Sydney the terminal of the Fast Atlantic Line.

He declares the journey from Montreal to Halifax can be made from in 15 to 19 hours and if Halifax can be reached from London in three and a half days, Montreal in a little over four, Chicago in six, Vancouver in nine and Japan in eighteen it would impress the world with Canada's importance as nothing else can.

He thinks Galway or some other Irish port should be the trans-Atlantic terminus.
