DYING BRAKEMAN'S FAREWELL.
 LONDON, Ont., May 8.—Charles Addison, a young Grand Trunk brakeman, met with a terrible accident yesterday. He was running to turn a switch for a loaded car, when his foot caught in a frog. He was unable to release himself and the car passed over his abdomen and legs, his limbs being almost severed from his body. The youth displayed marvellous nerve, talking to his friends as he lay on the ground, shaking hands with them, and saying that he did not expect to recover. He was cared for at the hospital, but was too weak to stand an operation. Addison was about 22 years old.

IRON INSTITUTE HONORS CARNEGIE.

LONDON, May 8.—The annual meeting of the Iron and Steel Institute here yesterday was largely attended. After being formerly installed in the chair, the new president, Andrew Carnegie, who remarked that he was the first president of the institute who was not a British subject, presented Sir James Kitson, a former president of the institute with the bessemer gold medal for 1903. Mr. Carnegie subsequently delivered his inaugural address, which was listened to with much interest.

A TRAVELLING MAN'S OPINION OF CANADIAN TRADE IN THE WEST INDIES


