EMPIRE PAYS HOMAGE TO KING AND QUEEN ON SILVER JUBILEE

Canada To Join In World Wide Celebration

Governor-General To Preside At Service At Parliament Hill Ottawa — Special Broadcasts.

OTTAWA, May 5—Canada will tomorrow join in world-wide Empire celebration of the 25th anniversary of King George's accession to the Throne. From coast to coast the people of the Dominion will unite with those of the Mother Country and sister dominions around the world in honoring the King. Guns will thunder forth the royal salute, bands and choirs will unite in patriotic song and music, prominent men and women will speak, and in Ottawa the harmony of the bells will float out over the capital and district from the peace tower of the Parliament buildings.

In Ottawa, where the key celebration of the Dominion will take place, citizens will gather on the beautiful square in front of the Parliament buildings to honor Their Majesties.

11 O'CLOCK SERVICE

Flag-draped old stone buildings, in which the government departments are housed, will flank the grass-carpeted square, in the centre of which stands a pavilion specially erected for the occasion. The ceremony is timed to begin at 11 o'clock with arrival of the Governor General and a party from Government House.

Before His Excellency reaches Parliament Hill, however, military parades will have converged upon it. Massed choirs from Ottawa churches will have taken their places from in front of the pavilion. It is estimated that more than 2,500 voices will join in the opening rendition of the National Anthem under the direction of three prominent Ottawa musicians.

Programme Of To-day's Celebration

The following official programme of today's Jubilee celebration, as announced by Colonel U. G. Dawson, Marshal, Jubilee parade, is reprinted for the convenience of readers from Friday's Guardian:

1—GENERAL PARADE

The parade for the King's Jubilee Celebration will be held on Monday, May 6, and will form up on Queen Street, with the head of the column at Hugh's Corner, Queen Street ready to move to Victoria Park at 2:30 p. m.

2—DRESS

The dress worn on this parade will be as follows: Units of the Non-Permanent Active Militia, service dress with medals. Fraternal organizations, the type of dress considered most advisable by the organization.

THOUSANDS GATHER AT PALACE

BONFIRES TO BLAZE ALONG PATHWAY

OTTAWA, May 5—New interest was added to the Toronto Scout beacon project in celebration of the King's Silver Jubilee May 6, by word that His Majesty will participate in the lighting of the first of a chain in the United Kingdom. From a room in Buckingham Palace the King will light a beacon in Hyde Park. Five minutes later Scout fires will flare up on hill and mountain tops in every section of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

Chief Scout To Officiate

The Scouts of Canada will light a pathway of bonfires across the Dominion from the Atlantic to the Pacific, with Lord Baden-Powell, Chief Scout of the world, lighting the mid-Canada beacon at Winnipeg on the East to the West. United from the Canadian Scout celebration with a Scout chain of over 2,000 bonfires on the head lands and hill tops of England, Scotland and Ireland, a bundle of faggots from Epping Forest will kindle the Scout fire at Halifax, and there will be a pathway of fires will spread westward with the fall of darkness, from Sydney on the Atlantic, to Sidney, on the southern tip of Vancouver Island, on the Pacific. Each beacon will be preceded by the firing of a royal salute of 21 rockets, or by colored flares.

GO SLOW IN MADRAS

MADRAS, India, May 5—(C.P.)—The Madras government has ordered that motor speed in this city must not exceed six miles an hour at facing points and 15 miles per hour elsewhere except in a few sections where 20 miles is allowed.

Throng Given Permission To Camp In Park By King; Police Precautions Doubled

May Pick Up Signal

One of the eastern fires will burn on the tip of Gaspé, and it is hoped to pick up the signal for southern New Brunswick's first fire from a flame on Digby Head, across the Bay of Fundy. Fires on Prince Edward Island will give the signal for a number of fires across Northumberland Strait on the New Brunswick shore.

Great Service Of Thanksgiving To Mark Opening

London Besieged By Sightseers On Eve Of Accession Anniversary — Stately Service At St. Paul's Eagerly Awaited.

LONDON, May 5—A deep feeling of the significance of His Majesty's 25 years' reign dominated celebrating London tonight, on the eve of the great service of thanksgiving marking the Royal Silver Jubilee.

The gaiety of the capital took on a more subdued tone as the heart of the Empire awaited the stately service at St. Paul's Cathedral. But the streets, converted into a riot of color with blues and crimsons and gold and silver, remained densely packed.

UNIQUE IN HISTORY

Old-timers said London had never seen anything like the Jubilee celebrations, measuring the crowds by that historic yardstick—the memorable night of the signing of the Armistice.

Early birds around Buckingham Palace, which has been besieged for days past, caught a glimpse through open windows of His Majesty passing through the stately corridors on his way to breakfast. A tumultuous roar "God save the King" burst from the throats of 50,000 subjects as the King and Queen appeared tonight for 90 seconds on a balcony of the palace.

Review Reign

From the pulpits, though the real thanksgiving services will be held tomorrow and a week from today, the clergy anticipated the official beginning of the Jubilee with reviews of the glory of the King's reign and the strength of the Empire.

Heavy Traffic

Usually London streets are as deserted as country lanes on Sunday morning. Today, instead of a rush to the country and seaside, automobiles were headed to London to see the Jubilee decorations and drive along the Jubilee route.

CANCER FUND
