Hawk Sniper Leads Scorers In The N. H. L.

MONTREAL, Dec. 12 (CP)—Chicago's sharpshooting Johnny Gottselig picked up two assists last week and drew into a clean-cut lead in the race for National Hockey League scoring honors, according to official figures released tonight.

Gottselig, with seven goals and eight assists for 15 points, is two points up on Tommy Anderson of Americans who held the leadership jointly with Gottselig a week ago but failed to add to his six goals and seven assists since then.

Canadians Joe Blake, Bill Cowley of Boston, Nels Stewart of Americans, and his teammate Eddie Wiseman are bunched for third position with eleven points each, while one point behind come Marty Barry of Detroit, Ray Getliffe of Boston, Bryan Hextall of Rangers, and Paul Haynes and Herb Cain of Canadiens.

Gottselig and Blake are tied for goals with seven each, while Cowley remains the league's leading play-maker with nine assists.

Alex Levisky of Chicago saw little action last week and kept his penalty record clean, but remains the league's leading bad-timer with 22 minutes spent with the timers. Toronto's Bingo Kampman is only a minute behind, while Red Horner of Toronto and Joe Jerwa of Americans follow with 20 minutes each.

Unofficial statistics today showed Keating, a Providence Red, and McManus, a Hershey Bear, pacing the Maritimers with 11 points apiece. One point behind was Kuhn, another Rhode Islander.

Keating, from Saint John, McManus, former Moncton Hawk, and Kuhn, one time Truro Bearcat, have been the Eastern Provinces' most consistent marksmen the last three years. Keating led all the Maritimers last year and the year before.

Behind the leaders, but close enough to catch them, were Ron Hudson, formerly of New Glasgow, N. S., and Clarence Steele who used to play in Charlottetown. They have eight points apiece.

Crossley Sherwood of Saint John followed with seven. Sherwood and Hudson play for Providence and Steele for Hershey.

Leading scorer is McManus with seven goals while Keating is the top playmaker with eight assists.

Richardson Claims Goal As Hart Wins

HALIFAX, Dec. 12 (CP)—Kid Hart, veteran Moncton, N. B., fighter, scored a third-round technical knockout over Kid Richardson of Halifax in the main bout at the Labor Temple tonight.

The New Brunswick scrapper was knocked about the ring in the first round, but came out fighting in the second and smashed Richardson continually with a long right. He backed the negro into the ropes, lifted a left from the floor that hit Richardson's jaw and swung a terrific right to the jaw as Richardson headed for the canvas.

Hart, a veteran of hundreds of fights, ran to a neutral corner, while Richardson and his seconds claimed a foul. Referee Chisholm held a consultation with the Judges, and Bert Redmond declared the blow was foul.

The referee appealed to the Boxing Commission, and they ordered Richardson given five minutes rest. At the expiration of that time, the gong sounded for round three.

The Moncton southpaw rushed to the centre of the ring, but Richardson indicated he was unable to continue, and Referee Chisholm awarded Hart the verdict on a technical knockout.

Hart weighed 128, and Richardson 136.

Don Budge Again Is Named As Foremost Athlete In United States

NEW YORK, Dec. 12 (AP)—For his unprecedented achievements on the tennis court, Don Budge again tops the list as the United States foremost athlete of 1938.

In a nation-wide poll conducted by the Associated Press, the red-haired Californian was given top ranking by 26 of the 63 participating sports writers and enough seconds and thirds to roll up 122 points. During the year the tennis ace won the Australian, French, British and United States titles before turning pro for \$78,000.

Budge's triumph, however, was not as great as last year, when he was selected almost to the exclusion of all others. This time he was given a battle right down to the final halos by Henry Armstrong, great negro fighter who likewise created history by holding the featherweight, lightweight and welterweight championships at the same time.

The west coast boxer pulled 19 first-place votes and finished with 104, only 18 points back of Budge. There was a big gap between Armstrong and Johnny Vander Meer, Cincinnati southpaw who hurled two successive no-hit, no-run games for another record.
