The funeral of the late J. D. Reid took place yesterday afternoon from his late residence, Hillsboro St., to People's Cemetery. The pallbearers were C. C. Gardiner, B. Rogers, T. C. James, J. McEachern, Richard Hunt, D. Fairquharson and there was a very large attendance of citizens.

The death took place at his home in Bangay, on Dec. 31st, last of Michael Andrews, aged 73 years. About forty-four years ago the deceased fell from a building seriously injuring his spine. A short time afterward he was unable to move in bed only as he was moved by loving hands and was compelled to remain there for nearly nine years. Then he recovered somewhat and was able to do most of his own work on his farm for six or seven years. By taking a bad cold which settled in his back the unfortunate man was again confined to his bed for a period of about thirteen years. Since that time until a few weeks previous to his death he enjoyed fairly good health, when he again took a bad cold which resulted in his death. The late Mr. Andrews being a kind neighbour and an upright Christian man will be greatly missed in the community in which he lived. A sorrowing wife, one son and one daughter are left to mourn besides quite a number of brothers, sisters, and other relatives. The bereaved ones have the sympathy of quite a large circle of friends. The death occurred almost simultaneously on Friday, Feb. 6th, of Mrs. Robert Silliphant and her cousin, Spurgeon Silliphant, aged ten years, son of David Silliphant, both of Hunter River. Mrs. Silliphant was a lady of exemplary character and held in the highest esteem by all who knew her as was amply testified by the solicitude shown during her brief illness, and the large number of sorrowing friends who assembled to pay their last tribute of respect on Monday last when the remains were laid to rest. The funeral service was conducted by Rev. A. Millar and Sellers, pastors of the Presbyterian and Methodist congregations of Hunter River. Deceased was 35 years of age and leaves a sorrowing husband and eight children, the youngest an infant. Much sympathy is felt for the bereaved family in their sudden affliction. Master Spurgeon Silliphant was a promising boy and much loved by all who knew him. A father, mother and sister survive him. Immediately after the funeral of Mrs. Silliphant the mourners repaired to the home whence the only son had been called away. The same pastors conducted the solemn funeral service and the same concourse of people again wended their way to the Hunter River churchyard where a second grave received its dead. The incident was a peculiarly pathetic one and much sympathy is felt for the doubly bereaved relatives.

Of a former resident of Rose Valley who passed away in New Hampshire the White Mountain Reporter says:—John R. Gillis died at his home at Bartlett N. H. after a long and painful illness. John Roderick, son of Mardock and Margaret (MacDonald) Gillis, was born in Rose Valley P. E. I. Aug 5, 1814. Coming to the United States at the age of twenty he became interested in the construction of railroads, working on various roads in Arkansas, Maine and Vermont. He came to Bartlett in 1872 as a contractor in building the road bed of the Portland and Aggenburg railroad, now the Maine Central. He was also a merchant for eleven years in partnership with Arthur L. Meserve. He held the office of treasurer and town clerk several years. He was an honored and respected citizen. He was thrice married, his first wife being Katie L. Miserve of Bartlett, his last wife Lizzie J. Hayes of Rochester, who survives him. His only child, a daughter died several years ago. Mr. Gillis was a Mason of the 32nd degree and took great interest in the order. The funeral was held at the Congregation Church, Rev. Herbert Walker officiating. The Masonic burial service was conducted by members of the order from North Conway and Bartlett. A large number attended the services and the floral tributes were beautiful, showing the great esteem in which he was held. The remains were taken to Rochester for interment.
