Potato Inspection And Certification

Summary of Progress Made During The Year, Embodied in 1930 Report, Just Issued of The Dominion Botanist.

The following information was issued, without charge, in 1930. Important changes in the general regulations under the Destructive Insect and Pest Act, P. C. 557, went into effect on March 12, 1930.

Substantial progress was made in the seed potato certification work during 1930, both in the amount of field inspection work accomplished during the growing season, and in the quantity of seed potatoes inspected for shipment under the official certification tag.

The number of applications requesting field inspections with a view to certification, was 6,870. The number of fields listed for inspection was 9,707, for a total of 34,305 acres.

Approximately 81 per cent of the total acreage entered for inspection passed the two field inspections required for certification; this is the best record in this regard since the work was started.

It is now an indictable offence under the Destructive Insect and Pest Act to advertise or sell, in Canada, uncertified potatoes as seed potatoes, or to use any kind of "seed" tag, likely to mislead an unsuspecting public.

The spring shipments in 1930 amounted to approximately four hundred thousand bushels and the fall shipments to one million six hundred thousand bushels.

It is a comparatively simple matter to secure details of all shipments of fully tagged certified seed potatoes, but these do not include the quantity of potatoes, from inspected fields, that are disposed of locally for seed purposes.

The exports of potatoes from Canada in 1930 amounted to 7,127,688 bushels, valued at \$6,684,019. The principal markets were the United States, Cuba, Panama, Newfoundland, British Guiana, Trinidad, Bermuda, and Jamaica.

The total imports of potatoes into Canada in 1930, amounted to 843,655 bushels, valued at \$891,432; imports from the United States, amounting to 842,160 bushels, valued at \$889,421.

Included in the export figures are Certified Seed shipments to foreign countries, amounting to over one and a half million bushels. All certified seed is shipped with an official tag attached to each container of potatoes.

HARRISBURG, Pa., Sept. 2.—One bear is better in battle than two bulls any day. The Pennsylvania State Game Commission has been informed.

While the ratio may not apply in the Stock Exchange, in Pennsylvania a bear engaged in battle and killed two bulls, one of them a 600 pound animal two years old.

A claim for damages caused by the bear was presented the game commissioners by the owner of the bulls, Leonard Wright, Elk County.

COCHRANTON, Pa., Sept. 2. (U.P.)—The Perry highway, part of a proposed Lake Erie Gulf of Mexico route, has been completed with the exception of the baffling "fill" at Custard's swamp which has defied the efforts of highway engineers.

Thousands of cubic yards of earth have been dumped in the 2,000 foot stretch of highway through the swamp. The first "fill" disappeared almost overnight and only by adding large quantities of earth have the engineers succeeded in filling the stretch.

Tests are being made to determine whether an underground stream is carrying away the dirt. The 2,000 feet is the only part of Route 19 in Pennsylvania which is unpaired.

OKLAHOMA TO NAME AIRPORT AFTER WINNIE MAE OKLAHOMA CITY, Sept. 2. (U.P.)—The municipal airport here, to be dedicated Nov. 14 and 15 during a two day air show, will be named "Winnie Mae Airport" in honor of the famous monoplane which carried Wiley Post and Harold Gatty around the world in less than ninety days.

The plane was named for Mrs. Winnie Mae Pain, daughter of F. C. Hall, millionaire oil producer, who financed the flight. Post and Gatty in the "Winnie Mae" are to attend the dedication.
