THE P. E. ISLAND RAILWAY.
Passengers on the P. E. Island Railway west report the track in very rough and uneven condition. The prime cause of this is that the frost is leaving the ground, and all railways in northern latitudes have a similar experience in the spring of the year. Something also depends upon the nature of the soil. Where the roadbed is well ballasted and well drained the trouble is reduced to a minimum. The P. E. Island Railway was not sufficiently ballasted when first constructed, and owing to the deficiency of revenue the bed has not been kept up to the standard required to maintain smoothness at all seasons.
As is well known, good ballast is not easily available for some sections of the road, without hauling it long distances. This adds to the cost of keeping the road in complete condition. Moreover on a railway of narrow gauge with the cars necessarily narrower and shorter than on other roads, the rocking, pitching and swaying motion of the cars is considerably increased. This is a matter to be taken into account by passengers who are impressed with the present condition of the Island Railway, after passing over the more substantial broad-gauge roads of the mainland.
But it is to be observed that it is always sound economy to first make and afterwards maintain the permanent way solid and smooth. Apart altogether from the comfort of passengers, it requires much more engine power to haul a train over a rough track than over a smooth one. An uneven roadbed enormously increases the wear and tear of rolling stock and to a less extent of the track itself. It also greatly increases the danger of accidents. Doubtless the Superintendent of the Railway and his assistants fully realize, all that we have said, and would be glad to effect many improvements which are beyond their power. The hand that holds the purse-strings is in Ottawa.
The New York Legislature has passed the insurance bill framed in close accord with the recommendations of the Armstrong Committee. It is a sweeping measure and will afford safeguards against the greed and graft which were revealed by the notable investigation.
While opinions were somewhat equally divided between a sea-level canal and a canal with locks for the great Panama work, the earthquake at San Francisco goes far toward carrying a decision in favor of the first-named plan. With the canal at sea level there would be no expensive locks or dams to suffer from earthquakes, and the canal is distinctly within the earthquake belt.
The Scientific American tells that a Bill will probably be introduced during the present session of the British Parliament to authorize again the construction of the Tunnel to connect England and France. Years ago the work was begun but was stopped because of a war scare. The Scientific American regards the work as of comparatively easy construction. It will be 2 1/2 miles in length, or three times as long as the Tunnel we are asking for to connect this Island Province with the mainland of Canada.
