FORTY-FOUR DOLLARS BURNED EVERY MINUTE.

TORONTO, Ont., Jan. 5.—About \$44 burned every minute during 1911 represented the fire waste of Canada last year. J. B. Linnell, secretary of the National Fire Insurance Association, in an important article to the annual meeting of the Monetary Times, pleading for efforts to make a halt in the area of waste. The result of sixteen fire companies doing business the world over are compared in the columns of this issue showing their belief in Canada, the U. S. P. and the world, respectively. Henry Lyle, the well known adjuster of values, discussed the relation of fire waste to fire insurance.

FOUR PERSONS DIE IN MYSTERIOUS MANNER

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Jan. 8.—There is a mystery surrounding the death of four persons whose bodies, fully clothed, were discovered today in a second story back room boarding house of Mrs. Bridget Flanagan. Mrs. Flanagan, one of the victims, 38 years old, her daughter Annie, 10 years, and Joseph, 15 months, an adopted child, died with her. The fourth body that of Miss C. Murray 18 years a boarder in the house who recently came to this country from Ireland. The police officials and coroner investigating the case are unable to determine whether the death were caused by coal gas or whether poison had been administered in the milk. The latter theory is supported by the finding of some crystals in an empty milk pitcher. The crystals had not yet been analyzed.

BOMBS FROM BALLOON SELDOM MISSED TARGETS.

ROME, Jan. 6.—The new military dirigible balloon went through some important manoeuvres at the aviation camp at Bacciano yesterday. Bombs were dropped at targets with extraordinary precision, the average being 90 percent of hits, while the balloon was travelling at the rate of 45 kilometres (about 28 miles).

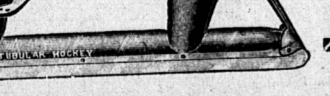

The pupils of the Stanley Bridge High School recently presented their teachers, James McGuigan, principal, with a beautiful box of writing paper and the assistant, Ella Martin, with a jewel case.

Vincent Callaghan, son of James Callaghan, Post-office Department, leaves for Ottawa tomorrow to take a position in the Civil Service Department. He attended the Union Commercial College where he was prepared for his examinations.

John E. Bell, City, of the firm of Buntain & Bell, returned yesterday morning on the C. G. S. Earl Grey, from Westmount, Montreal, where he had been spending the holidays with his daughter Nellie, as the guest of William and Mrs. Wright.

A. P. Prowse, M. P. P., arrived in the city yesterday morning accompanying the remains of his mother-in-law, Mrs. J. W. Kirkland, who died at his residence, Murray Harbor, Sunday. The deceased who was over 85 years of age, had been suffering for about five weeks from an illness brought on as the result of a fall. The late Mrs. Kirkland was born in Rexton, N. B., and was a half-sister of Lt. Governor Tweedie of New Brunswick. She has resided at Murray Harbor for the past nineteen years. She leaves one son, Lawrence Kirkland, of Watsoville, Cal., and three daughters, Mrs. A. P. Prowse, Murray Harbor; Mrs. Thomas Girvan, Galloway, N. B.; Mrs. (Dr.) McIntosh, Murray River. The remains will be taken to Rexton, N. B., today for interment.

About 80 students from P. E. Island registered at the Agricultural College, Truro, N. S., on the first two days of the short course, and about 220 from N. S., and N. B., fruit growing and bee raising occupied most of the time. Prof. Shaw taking charge of the former classes and Principal Curming, of the latter. On Wednesday evening, Ralph Messenger, of Bridgetown, lectured on orchard cultivation. He strongly advised the ploughing of the orchard late in the autumn. In the first place it prevented the spreading of the spores, in the spring, which cause the spot on the apples, and it incorporates the leaves into the soil which would probably be blown out of the orchards by the high winds. He gave a list of apples for the home orchard as follows:—Early Crimson Beauty, Fall Duchess, Wealthy and Fameuse Winter Dudley or North Star and Fameuse and for commercial apples he recommended Baldwin, Gravenstein, and King. These he said however applied to the Annapolis Valley. I. C. Craig of Amherst, Inspector of Public Schools then lectured on bee keeping. He showed a practical knowledge of the subject and gave much valuable information and arranged to conduct classes on the following days for those particularly interested.

On New Year's evening the home of Angus F. and Mrs. Beaton, Alexandria, was the scene of a very interesting event when their daughter, Inez J. became the wife of John B. B. Saunders, Murray River, at the hour of 6 p. m. The bride entered the parlor leaning on the arm of her father. The young couple took their places and Rev. D. The bride was attended by her sister, Miss Hettie Beaton, while Peter White of Charlottetown supported the groom. They remained standing while the friends present gave expression of their best wishes for their happiness. Supper was then served and consisted of everything that culinary art and effort combined could produce, and was duly partaken of by all present. About 7 p. m., a company of chevriers arrived and gave many expressions of goodwill to bride and groom. After being treated they dispersed to their homes. The bride was charmingly attired in silk striped violet with gold and satin ribbon trimmings. The bridesmaid wore white mull with lace and pink ribbon trimmings. A pleasant evening was spent in games and vocal music. The number of handsome and useful presents received showed the esteem and respect in which the young couple were held by their many friends. The bride's going away suit was of blue cloth with silk waist to match piped in paddy green and wore a picture hat with white plumes. Mr. and Mrs. Saunders left on the following afternoon on the Murray Harbor train for their future home.
