The deceased was third engineer of the Stanley a position he took over a year ago after completing his apprenticeship with Bruce Stewart & Co. He was a most likeable young man and had a promising career before him. Recently, at Pictou, he caught a cold which increased until the patient's condition had become serious. When the steamer arrived in this port on Tuesday Neil was at once taken home and his father summoned from Summerside, where he was on business. He returned in time to be with his son before the end came at 10 o'clock yesterday morning. It is thought that the cold and complications induced brain trouble which proved fatal. There are left to mourn besides his parents his two sisters Ida and Ann and one brother, John.
