**The Markets At A Glance**

WINNIPEG, March 1—(CP)—  
 Rye futures in the postwar grains  
 market of the Winnipeg Grain Ex-  
 change today showed higher prices  
 in all months. May advanced two  
 cents to close at \$2.49 bid.

CHICAGO, March 1—(AP)—  
 Speculative interest prodded both  
 sides of trading today in May Rye,  
 whipping prices around fairly rapidly  
 although moderately, most of the  
 time.

NEW YORK, March 1—(AP)—  
 The stock market today got off to a  
 stumbling start on the new month  
 and while scattered issues con-  
 tested the shift with a show of  
 relative strength and dealings were  
 among the slowest of the past eight  
 months many leaders dipped frac-  
 tions to around 2 points.

The Associated Press 60-stock  
 average was off .2 of a point at 73.  
 8.

MONTREAL, March 1—(CP)—  
 Trends were moderately higher on  
 average today on the stock ex-  
 change and curb market as the  
 rally which followed sharp breaks  
 in prices on Monday and Tuesday  
 continued. Losses incurred in the  
 tumbles have not, however, been  
 completely recovered. All key  
 groups were better in the indices  
 failed to move away from Thurs-  
 day's closing average. The mining  
 groups advanced to show index  
 gains of 36 for the Base Metals and  
 72 for the golds.

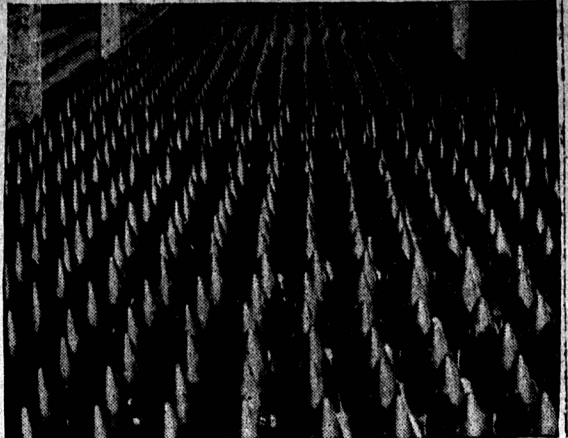
A general note of strength was fea-

**NOW THE LID IS OFF**



It is late summer, 1943. At Montreal  
 and Quebec, 49 Canadian National  
 Express cars are being hurriedly, yet  
 carefully loaded with thousands of  
 tons of shells, hand grenades and—  
 odd as it may seem—rubber footwear.  
 The loading of the munitions at the  
 various plants is being done under  
 the protection of armed guards. On  
 each of the four special trains needed,  
 only one person, a sworn-in, armed  
 head office employee of the C.N.  
 Express, knows what the supplies are  
 for and where they are going.

Until now it was a secret.  
 More than 3,000 miles away, the  
 Japanese were making strategic de-

fence posts against the threat. In-  
 vasion by American and Canadian forces  
 was decided. D-Day was set. But  
 special equipment and munitions had  
 to be obtained quickly for the par-  
 ticular type of warfare to be waged.  
 The supplies were sent to the invasion  
 force on the fastest C.N. Express  
 schedule to the most distant point on  
 the System's Pacific Coast line.

Thousands of shell casings, one of  
 hundreds of similar shipments  
 handled by the C.N. Express during  
 the war, are shown being loaded in a  
 car on their way to a shell-filling  
 munitions plant. When the shells were  
 filled with explosives, only a small  
 number was placed in a car, packed in  
 protective cases and specially loaded.

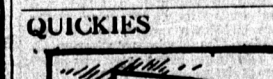
