A HOME BATTLE ON RECIPROCITY.

The closing days of the Legislative session were marked by the discussion of two widely different questions, but both important—our representation at Ottawa and reciprocity with the United States.

Now, we submit that both of these questions are such as might have called forth honest differences of opinion among thinking men.

But still there was room for some difference of opinion, and doubtless a difference of opinion would have developed had the question been one in which party interests were involved.

It was clearly open to Mr. Mathieson and his followers to have evaded the question in the Legislature.

BYRCE PRAISES CANADA AND U. S.

DETROIT, Mich., April 21—Speaking of the relations between Canada and the United States, Ambassador Bryce said today: "It was observed by the premier of Canada a few weeks ago that these people, speaking the same language, living side by side without armies and navies facing each other, gave to the world the example of two people living together in mutual confidence and trust."

LONDON, April 21—The council of the London Chamber of Commerce tonight passed a resolution to accede to the request of the New York Chamber of Commerce to co-operate between Great Britain and the United States, as proposed by President Taft.
