DeSilva, professor of psychology at Massachusetts State College, who has been conducting a series of automobile driving tests.

AUSTRALIAN RAILWAY TIES HAVE LONG LIFE Railway ties cut from Australian hardwoods are said to have an average life of twenty-five years and under favourable conditions up to fifty years. Exports have been increasing, chiefly to New Zealand, China, South Africa and Egypt. Exports for the first seven months of this year are nearly double those for the corresponding period last year, according to the Industrial Department of the Canadian National Railway.

CRAWFORD FAVORS U. S. ZONE ENTRY MELBOURNE, Australia, Dec. 10.—(C. P.)—Jack Crawford, Australian tennis ace, stated on his return from overseas competition he favored challenging in the American Davis cup next year. If defeated by the United States, Australian players could return home without

undue loss of time. He would not be available, he said, if Australia competed in the European zone.
