Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, stony or stony and. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. CORY, C. M. G. AUTO RESTRICTIONS REMOVED ON CERTAIN ROADS

Executive Council, Prince Edward Island, 22nd August, 1918. His Honor the Lieutenant Governor or in Council has been pleased to order as follows:— That the restrictions prohibiting the operation of motor vehicles on Tuesdays and Fridays upon the Main Road leading from Burke's Corner, Southport, to the Keppoch Shore and Langley Beach, be, and the same are hereby removed. That the Hillsborough Bridge shall be open to motor vehicles during the first ten minutes of each hour from the hours of seven o'clock and ten minutes past eight o'clock a.m., and from the hours of five o'clock and ten minutes past six o'clock p.m. on Tuesdays and Fridays. That motor trucks may be operated on the roads between Charlottetown and Eldon by way of the old mail route and Vernon and by way of Mount Albion and Hazelbrook and also on the Hillsborough Bridge at any hour on week days including Tuesdays and Fridays. That the Sunday restrictions under "The Motor Vehicle Law" and Regulations thereunder are removed with respect to the following roads to enable persons to travel by automobiles to and from places of worship only, on Sundays, namely:— The Tryon Road between Township No. 27 and Victoria, Lot 29. The Augustine Cove Road between Augustine Cove Corner, Lot 28, and the Aboiteau on the Tryon Road. The road from Holland's Corner to Lead's Point. The Crapaud road from and including Crapaud to Lord's Hall on Tryon Road. The Cross Roads between Augustine Cove Road and the Tryon Road. ARTHUR NEWBERY, Clerk Executive Council.



WAR CANNING BULLETIN Issued by Canada Food Board

THE NEW PARADE

This is the highway to the community canning centre—the pooling of ideas, equipment and energy. It is the kind of thing that is going on all over the country, since Parkhill, Ont., made it go last year. Indeed, it "went" to such an extent that this small place managed to donate \$4,500 worth of canned goods in all during 1917. Hamilton set the ball rolling with its Fruit Kitchen, which was opened soon after war broke out. Now that community canning centre has taken hold and bids fair to be a permanent institution. It is the most recent phase of the art of canning. From \$300 to \$600 is sufficient to buy all the tables, slicers, paring machines, seeders and sealers, together with the canning outfit proper to do several thousand quarts per day. Get your equipment this year and it will serve you on many a future occasion. The community canning centre has come to stay.

BIRTH RATE IN GERMANY

Increase in Death Rate Over Number of Births During the War. Figures compiled by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics show an enormous increase in the death rate since the beginning of the war. This has become noticeable in the last few months, in Hamburg, in the last two weeks in December and the first two in January, the rate was

7.0, while the death rate was as great as 18.4, an excess of 163 per cent. In none of the 12 German cities which were noted did the birth rate exceed the death rate. On the other hand, the birth rate of Birmingham, England, was 24.0, as against the death rate of 14.4, in the week ended January 5. Both London and Edinburgh recorded a slightly smaller birth rate than death rate but most of the English cities more than held their own. In 1914 the infant mortality in Germany was very high, caused by the hot summer, bad economic conditions and lack of employment. The following year there was a great decrease in the infant death rate but also a falling off in the number of births. In three periods of 1915 the number of children born alive in 18 towns declined by 31,008, or 23.8 per cent. This decline was accompanied by a decline of 34.9 per cent. in infant mortality, effected by the relief afforded by the Imperial maternity and nursing allowance.
