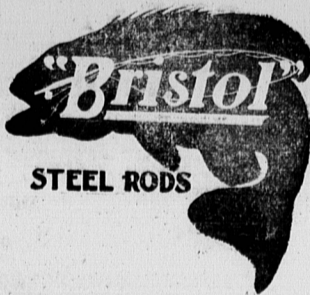

STOCK MARKET IS DULL AND WAITING

NEW YORK, March 24—The market Tuesday persisted in its waiting attitude, but instead of the marking time of yesterday there came about a halt. The undertone was strong until the first hour, and the demand, which it was filled on a rising scale of prices. This is commensurate with the conviction of the habitual trader in stocks that prices are entitled to an advance when "the sap begins to rise," tempered by consideration of possible complications in the money market on the first of the coming month.

Such news as came to hand was interpreted in a sense favorable to values of securities. The average price of 101.28 realized for the New York city 4 1/2 per cent. bonds proved higher than was expected at the time the market closed yesterday. The new bonds were dealt in "when issued," at prices above the list in the outside market yesterday and the older issues taken by foreigners was estimated by competent authorities amongst the international bankers at as high as 25 per cent. of the total. This would mean a supply of more than \$12,500,000, an important contribution to the needs of the debt balance of New York. There had to be taken into account, however, that the bond sale was made on an income basis of 4.155 per cent., compared with sales since February of 1908, on a basis of less than four per cent. At that time and in September, 1909, in the throes of the panic conditions, New York city bonds were sold to yield about 7 per cent. for the only other time in modern financial history. The result of the sale, therefore, serves to confirm rather than to refute the comparative disadvantage of present conditions for the enlistment of new capital.

The coppers were firm in expectation of the adoption of the Anaco plan at tomorrow's meeting. Reports that the Canadian tariff negotiations were working out favorably were helpful in sustaining prices. It was when profit-taking was attempted that the thinness of the market was made plain.

The tone of foreign exchange held firm, in spite of foreign subscriptions to the New York city bonds. Rates for the time money were shaded. Bonds were irregular; total sales, par value, \$3,844,000, United States bonds were unchanged on call.
