Contract Bridge

BAD PLAY

Today's declarer made a play that was superficially unimportant, or merely a "bad guess", but which in reality was a serious miscalculation.

South dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

♠ J 5 4
♥ K 6 3 2
♦ 7
♣ K 10 9 7 5

♠ 9
♥ 10 7 5
♦ 9 6 5 4
♣ 3 2

♠ A Q 10 8 7 3
♥ A J 4
♦ A J
♣ A 3

The bidding:
South West North East
1 ♠ Pass 2 ♠ Pass Pass
4 ♠ Pass Pass Pass

North's two-spade bid was the least of evils, his hand being too weak for a takeout to two clubs, and barely distributed for a response for one notrump.

West led the diamond king. Declarer won, and logically feeling that there was no hurry about ruffing his diamond jack, led a club toward dummy. When West played low, declarer went right up with the club king, probably with the thought that it was the best way to avoid the concession of two club tricks.

This was a sound enough idea in itself, but unfortunately it failed to embrace the considerations. East captured the club king and returned a diamond which was ruffed in dummy. South then took and lost the trump finesse. West returning a trump after taking in his king. Eventually South had to try for the heart finesse, and when this, too, failed, the excellent contract was down one.

It was not important whether South gave up one or two club tricks—the vital thing was to establish that club trick which was to lead immediately toward dummy, but to put in the nine, not the ace. It would, of course, lose to East's jack, but later South would lead his other club and play dummy's ten. The necessary club winner would then be set up, and the heart king in dummy would provide entry.
