The Co-operative Store has many patrons in Lorne Valley, and is daily increasing in popularity.—Miss Jennie Mustard, second year student at Prince of Wales College, spent the Easter holidays with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Mustard, of Cardigan Head.—Mr. Allan Shaw of Cardigan was to Lorne Valley on Tuesday last on a business trip.—Miss Jean McGrath spent a few days last week visiting friends at New Perth.—Mr. Lester Gay, of Riverton, has completed the work of hauling a barn for Mr. Angus Buchanan.—Messrs. McLeod and McGregor of Montague and Peter Carter of 48 Road, are busily engaged in buying potatoes at 48 Road Station. The record price of \$1.35 per bushel is being paid by the buyers, the highest price ever paid for potatoes in this vicinity. Both buyers have already secured large quantities of potatoes, and the supply is by no means exhausted.—Mr. Malcolm Macdonald, the efficient manager of the Lorne Valley Egg Circle, is receiving very large quantities of eggs from the circle patrons, many of whom supplied eggs throughout the entire winter, a somewhat unusual record in the annals of Egg Circles. ...**FUNERAL SERVICES**—The funeral of the late Donald McKay of Montague took place on Thursday afternoon, April 12th. There was a short service at the home then the remains were taken to St. Andrew's Church where before a large congregation the Rev. David Wright assisted by the Rev. A. S. Stewart late of Valleyfield conducted a very impressive service. With the passing away of Mr. McKay there is the removal of one of the land marks of King's County. He came from Scotland being born at Kilmuir Isle of Sky. He was three months old when his parents landed on P. E. I. His father settled at Kilmuir (named after the old home) and there Mr. McKay lived till he was twenty-six years of age, when he removed to Montague. He was thus closely identified with Montague for fifty years. In 1869 he married Annie the oldest daughter of Donald McLeod of Point Prim. There were children two of whom predeceased their father, viz: John Neil and Mortimer Jackson. Mr. McKay leaves a widow and five children all grown up. Mary Alice and Flora May married in the States. Sarah Ann and Walter Ross at home, whilst Major Attwood Talbot McKay has been at the front since nearly the beginning of the war. Capt. McKay left the Island in charge of one of the Siege Batteries and has made his

mark on the battlefield and is now Major, having gained his present rank by sheer merit. The death of Donald McKay leaves a blank in the village and much sympathy is felt for the family. All hoped that he would be spared till his son would return. It was not to be. The whole community showed their respect and sympathy on the day of the funeral.

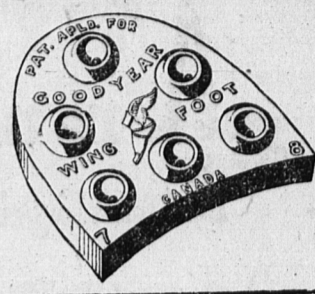

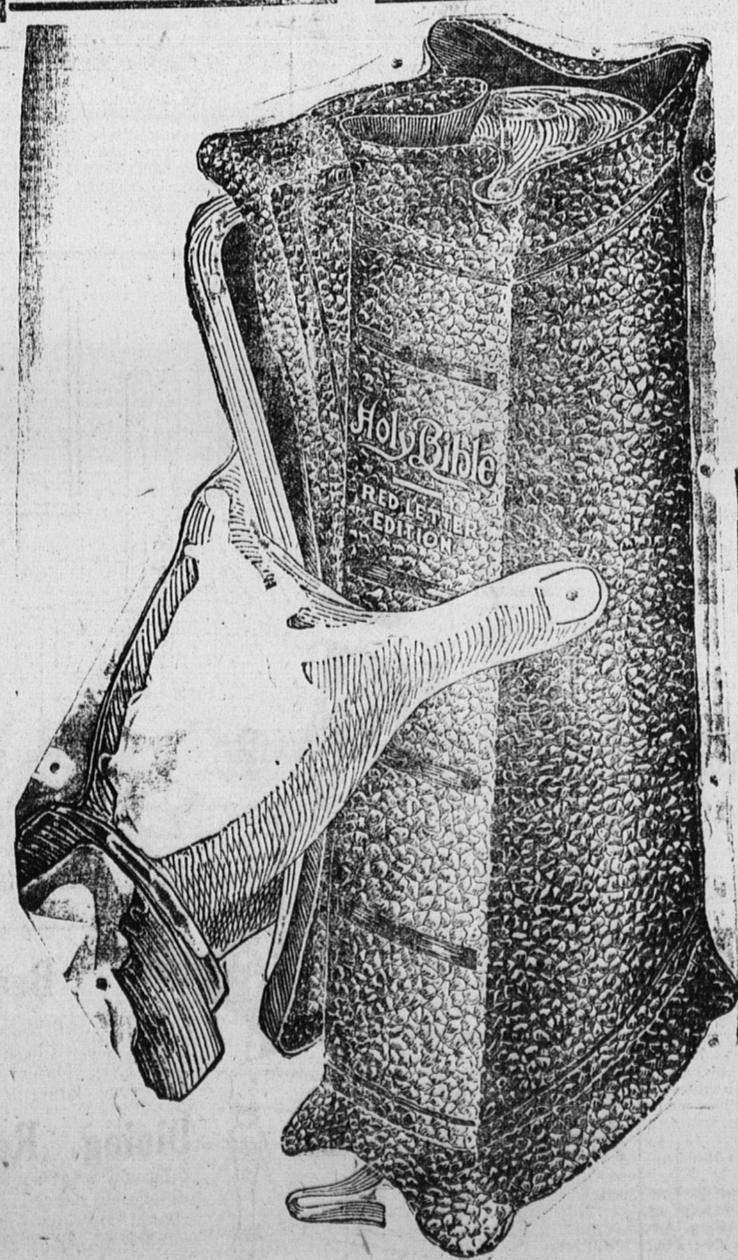

CURIOUS FACTS CONCERNING THE BOOK OF BOOKS
The Protestant Bible has 1189 chapters; 929 belong to the Old Testament and 260 to the New. The 117th Psalm is the middle chapter of the Bible, its number being 595. Exactly 594 chapters precede it, and 594 follow it.
The middle chapter of the Protestant Bible is also the shortest; containing only 33 words, composed of 133 letters. The longest is the 119th Psalm, containing 176 verses, 2,445 words, and 10,146 letters.
The text of the Red Letter Bible is divided into 31,101 verses; 23,144 for the Old, and 7,957 for the New Testament. The shortest verse in the Bible is John XI: 35 containing only two words with nine letters. One verse in the Bible contains all the letters of the alphabet except J — Ezra 7:21.
The famous inscription on the Liberty Bell, in Independence Hall, Philadelphia, is taken from Leviticus 25:10. It reads, "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto the inhabitants thereof."
