**N. Y. Stock Market Continues Recovery**

NEW YORK, April 17—(AP)—Selected stocks continued their recovery in today's market, but many others stumbled and a late rally, sparked by reports the telephone union had cut its wage demands, failed to follow through. Slowdowns were frequent from the start. While a slight pickup in activity appeared as prices improved at the beginning of the final hour, there were subsequent sluggish intervals and trends not irregular at the close. Transactors of 700,000 shares compared with 900,000 the day before and were a low for a full stretch since last Thursday. There was a little further purchasing by professional elements on the idea the technical comeback of Wednesday could be extended. Many traders and customers, however, stood aside or lightened accounts because of persistent bearishness over labor, wage-price situations, the business outlook and foreign affairs. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .1 of a point at 61.3. It was the narrowest 5-hour market since last Thursday, 941 issues registering. Of these, 413 rose and 315 fell. The average loss was due to the fact that several of the wider decliners were in the overall index. Dome Mines, with a gain of 7-8 in late trading, stood out among quiet Canadian issues. Distillers Seagram, off 1-4 at midday, closed down 1-8. Canadian Pacific was unchanged and McIntyre and Hiram Walker were unquoted. On the Curb, Lake Shore rose 1-2 at 122 1/2. Great Northern Railway 1-8 at 41 1/4 and U. S. Gypsum 1 1/2 at 96. In the plus column were N. Y. Central, Chesapeake and Ohio, Pullman, Youngstown Sheet, Goodyear, Woolworth, International Harvester, Deere and Sperry, Boeing, Kennecott, American Smelting, Western Oil and Standard Oil (NJ), American Telephone was unchanged at 164. Douglas Aircraft dropped 3 5/8 at 64 as the company's president painted a somewhat gloomy picture of earnings. Monsanto Chemical Common lost 2 at 52 and the Preferred was off 2 1/4 at 112 1/4 following destruction of the concern's Texas City plant. Norfolk and Western conceded 4 at 225. Bethlehem 1-2 at 29 1/2. Eastman Kodak 1 at 228 1/2. Johns-Manville 1 at 170 3/4 and Allied Chemical 1 at 15.
