NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—General Motors—Stay in strikers occupied a plant of General Motor Fisher Body Company today. Strikers also occupied the foundry of the Cadillac Car Co.—in all the foundry and three plants were closed and about 14,000 workers were jobless.

NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—American stocks are higher in London and Amsterdam than last night's New York close. Domestic overnight news is very mixed. Politically, developments seem to be breaking in favor of business. On the other hand business generally is not favorable because of stay in strikes in the Fisher Body plant and Cadillac foundry 14,000 plant workers have been made idle.

TORONTO, Nov. 18.—Eldorado—Shaft sinking on the Bonanza property of Eldorado has proceeded to a depth of 25 feet with silver showings reported, according to radio message to President Gilbert Labine in Toronto. The property on Great Bear Lake, Bonanza is seven miles southwest of the main silver radium workings on Labine point.

Report of C. C. Houston, Manager, covers all phases of the operations, with results of face and back samplings and concludes—"Bulk sampling completed October 1st was a considerable disappointment as it did not check the results previously obtained, especially on the west end with the final result that operations were discontinued."

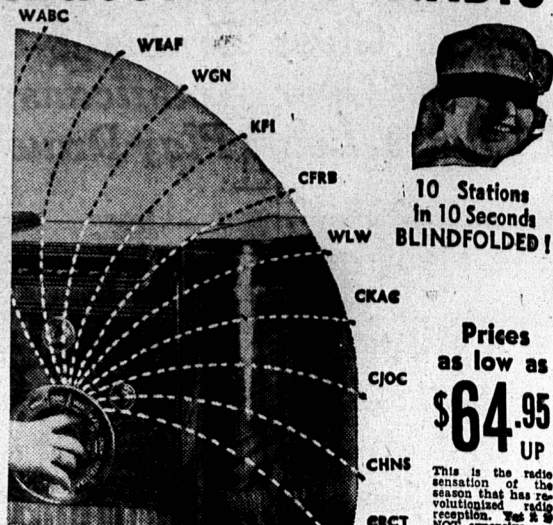
