"Convoy At Work—1675A. D."

You think the convoy system came into being during World War I to combat the German menace to our vital shipping lines? Wrong. Wrong by several hundred years.

Back in the seventeenth century the British Navy was regularly doing this job. One of the earliest known accounts of life in a convoy ship was written in 1675 in those days Barbary pirates were preying on English trade from their ports in Tripoli.

From the pen of the Reverend Henry Teonge we have some quaint and vivid pictures of the early convoys. Teonge became a naval chaplain at the age of 35 because he was penniless. He sailed in His Majesty's 36-gun frigate "Assistance" on a voyage from England to the Mediterranean with two merchant vessels, the "Scipio" and the "Mary."

When Teonge arrived in London in May 1675, to join his ship he was in a sorry state, riding an old mare, with all his worldly goods in sack which also served as a saddle. His possessions: "an old coat and breeches, an old pair of hose and a leathern doublet 9 years old and an upward."

The Captain of the ship received him and offered entertainment in the form of "bottles of slaret, etc." After that the reverend gentleman went ashore, wearing his belonging, and bought himself a small "seabed" - probably a hammock - and other equipment.

Manitoba Gov't has Big majority

WINNIPEG, April 25 - (CP) - Manitoba's non-partisan government, the first coalition war-time administration in Canada, today enjoyed the same overwhelming majority - 45 members - as it did before Tuesday's provincial election.

Two of the opposition - Maj.-Gen. H. D. B. Ketchen, Conservative, and L. St. G. Stubbs, Independent Progressive - were re-elected, and the opposition made gains among Assiniboia and Iberville, and captured a third seat in Winnipeg's 10-member constituency.

Of the 50 non-partisan government supporters elected, 37 were members of Manitoba's last legislature. The coalition standing with 21 Liberal-Progressives, 25 (21) Conservatives, 13 (14) Independents, 4 (3) Co-operative Commonwealth Federation, 3 (6) Social Credit, 3 (3) Independents, 1 (0) Liberal, 1 (0) and 1 (0) Independent.
